AMENDED RULES: THE CONDUCT OF LURE COURSING SANCTIONED EVENTS

EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2025

In accordance with the October 2024 Dogs Australia Board meeting minutes, the amended Rules for the conduct of Lure Coursing Sanctioned Events which will become effective from 1 January 2025 are now available from our website.

Please find below a summary of the rules revision changes provided by the National Lure Coursing Committee Chair, Anita Langford.

<u>Dogs Australia Lure Coursing Rules Revision</u> <u>Summary</u>

NOTE: References to the proposed new title 'Coursing Ability Champion' have been excluded from the rules as further discussion is required by the Board of Directors and this will be dealt with at the 2025 February Special Board meeting.

REGULATIONS PART 5 – CONFORMATION SHOW, SECTION 10.12 – AMENDMENT: EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2025

In accordance with Item 7.5.5 of the October 2024 Board meeting minutes, Clause 10.12 has been amended as follows and this amendment will be effective from 1 January 2025.

Currently reads:

Section 10.12 Sire and Dam of Merit (Added 06/24, 5.4 - effective 01/01/2025)

10.12.1 Sire of Merit (SOM) – A dog that has produced at least ten (10) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.2 Dam of Merit (DOM) – A bitch that has produced at least five (5) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.3 At least 1 of the conformation Champion titles (CH, GRCH, SUPCH, CIB, A2O) must have been awarded after the implementation date (01 January 2025).

Amended to read:

Section 10.12 Sire and Dam of Merit (Added 06/24, 5.4 - effective 01/01/2025)

10.12.1 Sire of Merit (SOM) – A dog that has produced at least ten (10) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.2 Dam of Merit (DOM) – A bitch that has produced at least five (5) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.3 At least 1 of the conformation Champion titles (all conformation titles are included) must have been awarded after the implementation date (01 January 2025).

Dogs Queensland, for the purposes of clarification, request that members note the following;

- Semen from the dog that has produced the Conformation Champion offspring is also valid.
- Overseas Conformation Champion Titles are also valid.



REGULATIONS PART 6 – THE REGISTER & REGISTRATION CLAUSE 6.34.4 AMENDMENT: EFFECTIVE 1 JULY 2025

In accordance with Item 5.6 of the October 2024 Board meeting minutes, Clause 6.3.4.3 of Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration has been amended as follows and will be effective from 1 July 2025.

Currently reads:

6.3.4.3 Effective from 1 January 2016 no 'Merle' Chihuahuas can be registered on any register and a 'Merle' Chihuahua imported into Australia cannot be registered on any register. (10/15, 6.4)

Amended to read:

6.3.4.3 Effective from 1 July 2025

Merle, Chihuahuas can only be registered on the Limited Register and notated "Never to be upgraded" once proof of breed purity and parentage has been confirmed by DNA profile.

REGULATIONS PART 6 – THE REGISTER & REGISTRATION, SECTION 7 AMENDMENTS: EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2025

In accordance with Item 7.5.14 of the October 2024 Board meeting minutes, the following amendments have been made to Section 7 and these amendments will be effective from 1 January 2025.

Insert New Clause 7.5

- 7.5 Multi Champion
- 7.5.1 Dogs awarded four or more Champion Titles one title must be a Conformation Champion the other titles from any three or more of the other ANKC Ltd recognised disciplines shall be granted the title "Multi Champion" and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Titles indicated in brackets e.g. M.CH. [O] [T] [TS]

7.5.2 In the case of an application for a "Multi-Champion" where the Neuter Champion replaces the Conformation Champion the title "Multi Champion" shall be granted and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline titles indicated in brackets e.g. M.CH. (Neuter) [O] [T] [TS]

Consequential Changes – Renumbering of existing Rule 7.5 as 7.6.

Insert New Clause 7.7

7.7 <u>Triple Grand Champion</u>

- 7.4.1 Dogs awarded three Grand Champion Titles one title must be a Conformation Grand Champion the other titles from any two of the other ANKC Ltd recognised disciplines shall be granted the title "Triple Grand Champion" and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Titles indicated in brackets e.g. TRIPLE GR. CH. [O] [T] [TS]
- 7.4.2 In the case of an application for a "Triple Grand Champion" where the Neuter Grand Champion replaces the Conformation Grand Champion the title "Triple Grand Champion" shall be granted and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline titles indicated in brackets e.g. TRIPLE GR. CH. (Neuter) [O] [T] [TS]

Insert New Rule 7.8

- 7.5 Multi Grand Champion
- 7.5.1 Dogs awarded four or more Grand Champion Titles one title must be a Conformation Grand Champion the other titles from any three or more of the other ANKC Ltd recognised disciplines shall be granted the title "Multi Grand Champion" and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Titles indicated in brackets e.g. M.GR. CH. [O] [T] [TS]
- 7.5.2 In the case of an application for a "Multi Grand Champion" where the Neuter Grand Champion replaces the Conformation Grand Champion the title "Multi Grand Champion" shall be granted and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline titles indicated in brackets e.g. M.GR. CH. (Neuter) [O] [T] [TS]

Consequential Changes – Renumbering of existing Rule 7.6 as 7.9.

REGULATIONS PART 9 – NON RESIDENT JUDGES AMENDMENT: EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2025

In accordance with Item 7.5.13 of the October 2024 Board meeting minutes, the following amendments have been made to Sections 1 and 2 of Regulations Part 9 – Non Resident Judges and these amendments will be effective from 1 January 2025.

1. General Regulations- All Judges

1.1 A Non Resident Judge must be able to verbally communicate with exhibitors to a degree that their directions and decisions are clearly

understood or have a competent interpreter.

- 1.2 If a Non-Resident Judge is unable to read English, the Club Affiliate or Organisation conducting the event is to provide an assurance that all ANKC Ltd Rules, Regulations, Policies, Procedures and breed standards have either been translated in writing into a language understood by the Non-Resident Judge or communicated orally. The assurance, signed by both the Affiliate or Organisation and the judge, must accompany the application.
- 1.3 The Affiliate conducting the show must have some knowledge of the Non Resident Judge and their background and ability to judge.

2. Regulations – Conformation Judges

- 2.1 A Non-Resident Judge must be approved
 and have awarded in their Country of
 Residence Challenge Certificates, or their
 equivalent to a minimum of 70% of the Major
 breeds* in each group as per the ANKC Ltd
 recognised Group/Breed list. A judge approved
 to judge 70% of the major breeds within a
 Group may judge the whole or part of the
 Group if split. (05/05) (Amended 10/22, 5.2,
 Effective 01/01/2023)
- 2.1 Unless forbidden by the Regulations of their Country of residence, for a Non-Resident Judge to be approved to judge Group Specials in Australia, but not the individual breeds for which they are not approved at breed level, they must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates or their equivalent, to a minimum of 70% of the Major breeds* in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/ Breed list.

*Major Breed a breed that has an average of 60 plus registrations over the last 3 years as recorded on the Dogs Australia Website.

2.1.1 Best in Show at Championship or CACIB Shows can only be judged by judges who are approved to judge Best in Show in their Country of Residence, provided that judge is approved by ANKC Ltd to judge at least 4 Group Specials in Australia.

Alternatively, should a judge from a non FCI Country be able to judge 70% of the Breeds in each of the 7 Groups as per the ANKC Ltd

recognized Group/Breed list, the ANKC Ltd may then grant permission for that judge to judge Best in Show. FCI Judges Regulation 2 e prevents this alternative being applied to FCI Judges.

Delete current 2.2 as it is a duplication of current 2.1 2.2. A Non-Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent. to a minimum of 70% of the Breeds in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list. A judge approved to judge 70% of the breeds within a Group may judge the whole or part of the Group if split. (05/05)

2.2 Notwithstanding the provisions in 2.1 the following Regulations are currently applied by individual National Canine Organisations.

FCI

In accordance with FCI Show Regulations 2 e, judges from FCI National Canine Organisations may under no circumstances agree to judge a breed at any show for which they are not approved by their own NCO (National Canine Organization) and for which they are not listed in the FCI Judges Directory. The same applies for judging at Best in Group and Best in Show level.

When seeking approval to judge at an FCI International Show in Australia, a Non-Resident Judge may only apply to award the CACIB to breeds for which they are individually listed in the FCI Judges Directory, failing to comply with this requirement will result in the FCI invalidating the confirmation of the CACIBs incorrectly awarded. For non CACIB breeds listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

Canadian Kennel Club (CKC)

CKC Licensed judges are permitted to judge at Championship Shows in foreign countries and issue Challenge Certificates only for breeds that they are licenced for in Canada.

For breeds that are not recognised in Canada, that are listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog Murray Valley Retriever, and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges, after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

At FCI International CACIB Shows CKC judges are only allowed to judge and award CACIB's to the breeds that they are approved to judge at Championship Shows in Canada. For breeds that are not recognised in Canada but are recognised by both ANKC Ltd and the FCI on a definitive basis, and are listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog Murray Valley Retriever, and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges, after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

The Royal Kennel Club (UK)

Where an applicant is approved by the Royal Kennel Club, to judge a group or Groups at Championship Show level, and has Open Show experience or has issued Challenge Certificates outside England, subject to compliance with 2.1, may be approved to judge at Group level in Australia for those groups/breeds so qualified, subject to the Non-Resident Judge providing the details required, listed as follows:

- (a) Date of Open / FCI / Green Star Shows
- (b) Name of Show
- (c) List of Breed/s judged
- (d) Number of Dogs judged in each Breed
- (e) List of "any other variety" breeds judged together with the number of dogs in each breed judged.

The above information is to be provided with the initial application for approval.

At FCI International CACIB Shows RKC judges are only allowed to judge and award CACIB's to the breeds that are recognised by the FCI on a definitive basis and that they are approved to judge and award Challenges to at Championship Shows in the United Kingdom.

For breeds that are not recognised by the Royal Kennel Club, listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

American Kennel Club (AKC)

AKC Licensed judges are permitted to judge at Championship Shows in overseas countries and issue Challenge Certificates only for breeds that they are licenced for in the USA. For Miscellaneous and FSS (Foundation Stock Service Breeds) and breeds that are not recognised by the AKC, listed in Appendix B to these Regulations including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

At FCI International shows, AKC judges are eligible to judge and award the CACIB provided that the following conditions are fulfilled:

- The breeds they are scheduled to judge are recognized by the AKC (this does not include Miscellaneous and FSS.
- 2. They are allowed, under AKC regulations, to judge the breeds in question at AKC events and award them championship points.

For Miscellaneous and FSS and breeds that are not recognised by the AKC but are recognised by both ANKC Ltd and the FCI on a definitive basis and listed in Appendix B to these Regulations including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

NB *Open Book Examinations will be compiled by the Overseas Judges Approval Board, will be available on the Dogs Australia Website, the completed examinations must accompany the initial application for approval

2.3 Now not relevant, delete in its entirety

2.3. Where a Non Resident Judge has been invited to judge a single breed, or up to three breeds at any one show then that person must be approved and have awarded in their Country of residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent, for that or all breeds to be judged. Where the two and/or three breeds comprise the whole show and a Non Resident Judgehas been invited to judge Best in Show at the show, the Non Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of residence Challenge Certificates to one of the breeds and must have Open Show experience in each of the other breeds, to be approved to judge Best in Show. The Open Show experience must be at least three (3) shows per breed, with a total number of dogs judged for each breed to be at least 100. (10/99)

Delete current 2.4 now covered by 2.1.1

2.4. Best In Show can only be judged by judges who

are approved to judge Best In Show in their Country of Residence, provided that judge is approved by ANKC Ltd to judge at least 3 Group Specials in Australia. (05/05) 2.4.1. Alternatively should the judge be able to judge 70% of the Breeds in each of the 7 Groups as per the ANKC Ltd recognized Group/Breed list, the ANKC Ltd may then grant permission for that judge to judge Best in Show. (05/05) 2.4.2. Where a judge conforms with 2.1 that judge may judge Group Specials. (05/05)

Delete Current 2.5 now covered by 2.2

2.5. Where an applicant is approved by the Kennel Club England to judge a group or Groups at Championship Show level, and has Open Show experience or has issued Challenge Certificates outside England may be approved to judge at Group level in Australia for those groups/breeds so qualified, subject to the Non Resident Judge providing the details required, listed as follows: (a) Date of Open / FCI / Green Star Shows (b) Name of Show (c) List of Breed/s judged (d) Number of Dogs judged in each Breed (e) List of "any other variety" breeds judged together with the number of dogs in each breed judged. The above information is to be provided with the initial application for approval of an Overseas Judge (05/05)

2.5 Renumbered

- 2.3 Where an application has been received from a Non Resident Judge who has previously been approved by their Country of Residence's Controlling Body to award Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent, in their Country of Residence, and are currently on an "inactive" list due to being employed by their Controlling Body, and their Country's Rules and Regulations prevent them from judging in their Country of Residence, they may be approved to judge in Australia, subject to:
- 2.3.1 The person has awarded Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent, in their Country of Residence within the previous ten [10] years, and;
- 2.3.2 The person has judged the breeds they are seeking approval for within the last three[3] years at a recognised show conducted under the auspice of a recognised Controlling Body.
- 2.4 Judges who have moved their country of residence and are not approved to judge some or all the breeds in their new country

of residence that they were approved to judge in their original country of residence, will be eligible to be approved by the ANKC Ltd to judge the breeds they were approved to judge in their original country of residence. Judges, who have been licenced by a neighbouring Country which is not their Country of Residence, shall be allowed to Judge on furnishing documentation from their Country of Residence and their Country of Licence. (05/05)

2.5 A Non Resident Judge approved on a provisional permit or apprentice basis is not eligible for approval to Judge at Championship Shows in Australia for those breeds or Groups subject to such provisional permit or apprenticeship.

2.8 Now not relevant, delete in its entirety

2.8. A Non-Resident Judge on their first judging assignment in Australia will not be permitted to judge more than four shows in one state/territory on his first tour.

ANKC LTD CONSTITUTION – AMENDMENTS: EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2025

In accordance with Item 7.4 and 7.5 of the Annual General Meeting, the following amendments to the constitution were endorsed and will be effective from 1 January 2025.

ANKC Ltd Constitution – Amendment to Part 1
Objects & Related Matters, Clause 3(t)

Currently reads:-

(t) To collect, verify and publish information relating to Dogs registered in the Register of Associate Dogs and of Exhibitions of such Dogs.

Amended to read:-

(t) To collect, verify and publish information relating to Dogs registered in the Register of Associate **and Sporting Dogs** and of Exhibitions of such Dogs.

ANKC Ltd Constitution – Amendment to Part II
Objects & Related Matters, Clause 9: Definitions and
Interpretation

Constitution of ANKC Ltd, Part II: Objects & Related

Matters, Clause 9: Definitions and Interpretation, be amended by the inclusion of an additional Definition for "Sporting Register Dogs", as follows:-

9. Definitions and Interpretation

"Sporting Dog" means a Dog that is registered with a Dogs Australia recognised Working Dog Association or Kindred Body that caters for Working, Sporting or Performance Dogs.

INCREASE TO OVERSEAS JUDGES APPLICATION APPROVAL FEES – EFFECTIVE 1 JULY 2025

In accordance with Item 7.3 of the October 2024 Annual General Meeting, the fees for Overseas Judges' approvals will be as follows effective from 1 July 2025.

\$121.00 – Applications lodged 9 months prior to the show

\$231.00 – Applications lodged less than 9 months prior to the show

The above fees include Dogs Australia obtaining verification of the qualifications of the judge and are GST inclusive and will apply for all applications received by the Dogs Australia office from 1 July 2025.

A new fee of \$33.00 (inclusive of GST) will be introduced from 1 July 2025 for each request to amend an existing approval.

SUMMARY OF THE DOGS AUSTRALIA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING & BOARD MEETING HELD IN BRISBANE ON 19 & 20 OCTOBER 2024

At the recent Annual General Meeting of the Australian National Kennel Council Limited held in Brisbane:

1. Election of ANKC Ltd Executive

- Mr Hugh Gent OAM was re-elected unopposed as President for a three-year term from 19 October 2024;
- Ms Pam Campbell was elected unopposed as Vice President for a one-year term from 19 October 2024:
- Mr David Sales was re-elected unopposed as Treasurer for a one-year term from 19 October 2024;
- Mr Brian Parker was re-elected as a member of the Executive Committee for a one-year term from 19 October 2024.

2. Increase to Overseas Judges Application Approval Fees

It was resolved that the fees for Overseas Judges approvals be set as follows effective from 1 July 2025:

\$121.00 (incl GST) – (If lodged 9 months prior to the show) \$231.00 (incl GST) – (If lodged less than 9 months prior to the show) \$33.00 (incl GST) – (new fee applicable for each request to amend an existing approval)

3. ANKC Ltd Constitution – Amendment to Part 1 Objects & Related Matters, Clause 3(t)

It was resolved that the Constitution of the Company be amended by as follows:

THAT the Constitution of ANKC Ltd, Part 1: Objects & Related Matters, Clause 3(t), be amended as follows:-

Currently reads:-

(t) To collect, verify and publish information relating to Dogs registered in the Register of Associate Dogs and of Exhibitions of such Dogs.

Amended to read:-

(t) To collect, verify and publish information relating to Dogs registered in the Register of Associate and Sporting Dogs and of Exhibitions of such Dogs.

This amendment is effective from 1 January 2025.

4. ANKC Ltd Constitution – Amendment to Part II Objects & Related Matters, Clause 9: Definitions and Interpretation

It was resolved that the Constitution of the Company be amended by as follows:

THAT the Constitution of ANKC Ltd, Part II: Objects & Related Matters, Clause 9: Definitions and Interpretation, be amended by the inclusion of an additional Definition for "Sporting Register Dogs", as follows:-

9. Definitions and Interpretation

"Sporting Dog" means a Dog that is registered with a Dogs Australia recognised Working Dog Association or Kindred Body that caters for Working, Sporting or Performance Dogs.

This amendment is effective from 1 January 2025.





At the October 2024 Dogs Australia Board meeting, Directors resolved/considered the following:

1. * Regulations Part 2 – Judges

It was resolved that Regulations Part 2 – Judges, Section 3 be amended as follows:

Currently reads:

3.2 The number of dogs any one judge may judge on any day (excluding Group and General Specials) is 250 exhibits, except in extenuating circumstances with the prior approval of the judge and the Member Body. (09/71) (Amended 10/12 – 7.5.3, 10/13 – 5.6.4) (Amended 10/17, 7.5.7 – Effective 01/01/18)

Be amended to read:

- 3.2.1 The number of dogs any one judge may judge on any day where that judge is only contracted to judge no more 1 Group (excluding Group and General Specials) is 250 exhibits including Sweepstakes Classes, except in extenuating circumstances with the prior approval of the judge and the Member Body. (09/71) (Amended 10/12 7.5.3, 10/13 5.6.4) (Amended 10/17, 7.5.7 Effective 01/01/18)
- 3.2.2 Where a Judge is contracted to judge more than 1 Group on any day (excluding Group and General Specials) is 200 exhibits including Sweepstakes Classes, except in extenuating circumstances with the prior approval of the judge and the Member Body.

These amendments will be effective from 1 July 2025.

2. * Regulations Part 5 – Conformation Shows

It was resolved that Regulations Part 5 – Conformation Shows Section 10.12 be amended as follows:

Currently reads:

Section 10.12 Sire and Dam of Merit (Added 06/24, 5.4 - effective 01/01/2025)

10.12.1 Sire of Merit (SOM) - A dog that has produced at least ten (10) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.2 Dam of Merit (DOM) - A bitch that has produced at least five (5) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.3 At least 1 of the conformation Champion titles (CH, GRCH, SUPCH, CIB, A2O) must have been awarded after the implementation date (01 January 2025).

Be amended to read:

Section 10.12 Sire and Dam of Merit (Added 06/24, 5.4 - effective 01/01/2025)

10.12.1 Sire of Merit (SOM) - A dog that has produced at least ten (10) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.2 Dam of Merit (DOM) - A bitch that has produced at least five (5) Conformation Champion offspring.

10.12.3 At least 1 of the conformation Champion titles (all conformation titles are included) must have been awarded after the implementation date (01 January 2025).

These amendments will be effective from 1 January 2025.

3. * Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration

It was resolved that Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration Clauses 6.3.4.3 and 6.3.4.9 be amended as follows:

Currently reads:

6.3.4.3 Effective from 1 January 2016

no 'Merle' Chihuahuas can be registered on any register and a 'Merle' Chihuahua imported into Australia cannot be registered on any register. (10/15, 6.4)

Be amended to read:

6.3.4.3 Effective from 1 July 2025

Merle, Chihuahuas can only be registered on the Limited Register and notated "Never to be upgraded" once proof of breed purity and parentage has been confirmed by DNA profile.

Currently reads:

6.3.4.9 Effective from 1 July 2021

No 'Merle' French Bulldogs can be registered on any Dogs Australia register and a 'Merle' French Bulldog imported into Australia cannot be registered on any register. No 'Long Coat or Hairless' French Bulldogs can be registered on any Dogs Australia register. (Added 02/21, 5.2)

Be amended to read:

6.3.4.9 Effective from 1 July 2025

Merle, long coat and hairless French Bulldogs can only be registered on the Limited Register and notated "Never to be upgraded" once proof of breed purity and parentage has been confirmed by DNA profile.

These amendments will be effective from 1 July 2025.

4. * Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration

It was resolved that Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration Clause 3.2 (d) be amended be amended to remove the wording 'and c' in the second last row and change DAWR to DAWF as noted below:

d. Proof of Shipment from the country of origin to Australia such as transportation documents "Airway Bill" OR an Authorised Agency under the Bio Security Act 2016, Bio Security Release form (b and above are not required if you have the **DAWF** PAWR release)

These amendments will be effective immediately.

5. * Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration

It was resolved that Regulations Part 6 – The Register & Registration Section 7 be amended as follows:

Insert New Clause 7.5

- 7.5 <u>Multi Champion</u>
- 7.5.1 Dogs awarded four or more Champion Titles one title must be a Conformation Champion the other titles from any three or more of the other ANKC Ltd recognised disciplines shall be granted the title "Multi Champion" and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Titles indicated in brackets e.g. M.CH. [O] [T] [TS]
- 7.5.2 In the case of an application for a "Multi Champion" where the Neuter Champion replaces the Conformation Champion the title "Multi Champion" shall be granted and the title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline titles indicated in brackets e.g. M.CH. (Neuter) [O] [T] [TS]

Consequential Changes – Renumbering of existing Rule 7.5 as 7.6 (and associated sub-rules now 7.6.1, 7.6.2).







7. * Regulations Part 9 – Non Resident Judges

It was resolved that Regulations Part 9 - Non Resident Judges Sections 1 and 2 be amended as follows:

1. General Regulations- All Judges

- 1.1 A Non Resident Judge must be able to verbally communicate with exhibitors to a degree that their directions and decisions are clearly understood or have a competent interpreter.
- 1.2 If a Non-Resident Judge is unable to read English, the Club Affiliate or Organisation conducting the event is to provide an assurance that all ANKC Ltd Rules, Regulations, Policies, Procedures and breed standards have either been translated in writing into a language understood by the Non-Resident Judge or communicated orally. The assurance, signed by both the Affiliate or Organisation and the judge, must accompany the application.
- 1.3 The Affiliate conducting the show must have some knowledge of the Non Resident Judge and their background and ability to judge.

2. Regulations - Conformation Judges

- 2.1 A Non Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent to a minimum of 70% of the Major breeds* in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list. A judge approved to judge 70% of the major breeds within a Group may judge the whole or part of the Group if split. (05/05) (Amended 10/22, 5.2, Effective 01/01/2023)
- 2.1 Unless forbidden by the Regulations of their Country of residence, for a Non-Resident Judge to be approved to judge Group Specials in Australia, but not the individual breeds for which they are not approved at breed level, they must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates or their equivalent, to a minimum of 70% of the Major breeds* in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list.
- *Major Breed a breed that has an average of 60 plus registrations over the last 3 years as recorded on the Dogs Australia Website.
- **2.1.1** Best in Show at Championship or CACIB Shows can only be judged by judges who are approved to judge Best in Show in their Country of Residence, provided that judge is approved by ANKC Ltd to judge at least 4 Group Specials in Australia

Alternatively, should a judge from a non FCI Country be able to judge 70% of the Breeds in each of the 7 Groups as per the ANKC Ltd recognized Group/Breed list, the ANKC Ltd may then grant permission for that judge to judge Best in Show. FCI Judges Regulation 2 e prevents this alternative being applied to FCI Judges.

Delete current 2.2 as it is a duplication of current 2.1

- 2.2. A Non-Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent. to a minimum of 70% of the Breeds in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list. A judge approved to judge 70% of the breeds within a Group may judge the whole or part of the Group if split. (05/05)
- **2.2** Notwithstanding the provisions in 2.1 the following Regulations are currently applied by individual National Canine Organisations.

7. * Regulations Part 9 - Non Resident Judges

It was resolved that Regulations Part 9 - Non Resident Judges Sections 1 and 2 be amended as follows:

1. General Regulations- All Judges

- 1.1 A Non Resident Judge must be able to verbally communicate with exhibitors to a degree that their directions and decisions are clearly understood or have a competent interpreter.
- 1.2 If a Non-Resident Judge is unable to read English, the Club Affiliate or Organisation conducting the event is to provide an assurance that all ANKC Ltd Rules, Regulations, Policies, Procedures and breed standards have either been translated in writing into a language understood by the Non-Resident Judge or communicated orally. The assurance, signed by both the Affiliate or Organisation and the judge, must accompany the application.
- 1.3 The Affiliate conducting the show must have some knowledge of the Non Resident Judge and their background and ability to judge.

2. Regulations - Conformation Judges

- 2.1 A Non Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent to a minimum of 70% of the Major breeds* in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list. A judge approved to judge 70% of the major breeds within a Group may judge the whole or part of the Group if split. (05/05) (Amended 10/22, 5.2, Effective 01/01/2023)
- 2.1 Unless forbidden by the Regulations of their Country of residence, for a Non-Resident Judge to be approved to judge Group Specials in Australia, but not the individual breeds for which they are not approved at breed level, they must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates or their equivalent, to a minimum of 70% of the Major breeds* in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list.
- *Major Breed a breed that has an average of 60 plus registrations over the last 3 years as recorded on the Dogs Australia Website.
- 2.1.1 Best in Show at Championship or CACIB Shows can only be judged by judges who are approved to judge Best in Show in their Country of Residence, provided that judge is approved by ANKC Ltd to judge at least 4 Group Specials in Australia

Alternatively, should a judge from a non FCI Country be able to judge 70% of the Breeds in each of the 7 Groups as per the ANKC Ltd recognized Group/Breed list, the ANKC Ltd may then grant permission for that judge to judge Best in Show. FCI Judges Regulation 2 e prevents this alternative being applied to FCI Judges.

Delete current 2.2 as it is a duplication of current 2.1

2.2. A Non-Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of Residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent. to a minimum of 70% of the Breeds in each group as per the ANKC Ltd recognised Group/Breed list. A judge approved to judge 70% of the breeds within a Group may judge the whole or part of the Group if split. (05/05)

2.2 Notwithstanding the provisions in 2.1 the following Regulations are currently applied by individual National Canine Organisations.



FC

In accordance with FCI Show Regulations 2 e, judges from FCI National Canine Organisations—may under no circumstances agree to judge a breed at any show for which they are not approved by their own NCO (National Canine Organization) and for which they are not listed in the FCI Judges Directory. The same applies for judging at Best in Group and Best in Show level.

When seeking approval to judge at an FCI International Show in Australia, a Non-Resident Judge may only apply to award the CACIB to breeds for which they are individually listed in the FCI Judges Directory, failing to comply with this requirement will result in the FCI invalidating the confirmation of the CACIBs incorrectly awarded. For non CACIB breeds listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

Canadian Kennel Club (CKC)

CKC Licensed judges are permitted to judge at Championship Shows in foreign countries and issue Challenge Certificates only for breeds that they are licenced for in Canada.

For breeds that are not recognised in Canada, that are listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog Murray Valley Retriever, and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges, after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

At FCI International CACIB Shows CKC judges are only allowed to judge and award CACIB's to the breeds that they are approved to judge at Championship Shows in Canada. For breeds that are not recognised in Canada but are recognised by both ANKC Ltd and the FCI on a definitive basis, and are listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog Murray Valley Retriever, and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges, after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

The Royal Kennel Club (UK)

Where an applicant is approved by the Royal Kennel Club, to judge a group or Groups at Championship Show level, and has Open Show experience or has issued Challenge Certificates outside England, subject to compliance with 2.1, may be approved to judge at Group level in Australia for those groups/breeds so qualified, subject to the Non-Resident Judge providing the details required, listed as follows:

- (a) Date of Open / FCI / Green Star Shows
- (b) Name of Show
- (c) List of Breed/s judged
- (d) Number of Dogs judged in each Breed
- (e) List of "any other variety" breeds judged together with the number of dogs in each breed judged. The above information is to be provided with the initial application for approval.

At FCI International CACIB Shows RKC judges are only allowed to judge and award CACIB's to the breeds that are recognised by the FCI on a definitive basis and that they are approved to judge and award Challenges to at Championship Shows in the United Kingdom.

For breeds that are not recognised by the Royal Kennel Club, listed in Appendix A to these Regulations, including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

American Kennel Club (AKC)

AKC Licensed judges are permitted to judge at Championship Shows in overseas countries and issue Challenge Certificates only for breeds that they are licenced for in the USA. For Miscellaneous and FSS (Foundation Stock Service Breeds) and breeds that are not recognised by the AKC, listed in Appendix B to these Regulations including the Australasian



Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

At FCI International shows, AKC judges are eligible to judge and award the CACIB provided that the following conditions are fulfilled:

- The breeds they are scheduled to judge are recognized by the AKC (this does not include Miscellaneous and FSS.
- 2. They are allowed, under AKC regulations, to judge the breeds in question at AKC events and award them championship points.

For Miscellaneous and FSS and breeds that are not recognised by the AKC but are recognised by both ANKC Ltd and the FCI on a definitive basis and listed in Appendix B to these Regulations including the Australasian Bosdog, Murray Valley Retriever and Tenterfield Terrier, approval may be granted to award Challenges after the judge completes an ANKC Ltd Open Book Examination* on those breeds.

NB *Open Book Examinations will be compiled by the Overseas Judges Approval Board, will be available on the Dogs Australia Website, the completed examinations must accompany the initial application for approval

2.3 Now not relevant, delete in its entirety

2.3. Where a Non Resident Judge has been invited to judge a single breed, or up to three breeds at any one show then that person must be approved and have awarded in their Country of residence Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent, for that or all breeds to be judged. Where the two and/or three breeds comprise the whole show and a Non Resident Judge has been invited to judge Best in Show at the show, the Non Resident Judge must be approved and have awarded in their Country of residence Challenge Certificates to one of the breeds and must have Open Show experience in each of the other breeds, to be approved to judge Best in Show. The Open Show experience must be at least three (3) shows per breed, with a total number of dogs judged for each breed to be at least 100. (10/99)

Delete current 2.4 now covered by 2.1.1

2.4. Best In Show can only be judged by judges who are approved to judge Best In Show in their Country of Residence, provided that judge is approved by ANKC Ltd to judge at least 3 Group Specials in Australia. (05/05) 2.4.1. Alternatively should the judge be able to judge 70% of the Breeds in each of the 7 Groups as per the ANKC Ltd recognized Group/Breed list, the ANKC Ltd may then grant permission for that judge to judge Best in Show. (05/05) 2.4.2. Where a judge conforms with 2.1 that judge may judge Group Specials. (05/05)

Delete Current 2.5 now covered by 2.2

2.5. Where an applicant is approved by the Kennel Club England to judge a group or Groups at Championship Show level, and has Open Show experience or has issued Challenge Certificates outside England may be approved to judge at Group level in Australia for those groups/breeds so qualified, subject to the Non Resident Judge providing the details required, listed as follows: (a) Date of Open / FCI / Green Star Shows (b) Name of Show (c) List of Breed/s judged (d) Number of Dogs judged in each Breed (e) List of "any other variety" breeds judged together with the number of dogs in each breed judged. The above information is to be provided with the initial application for approval of an Overseas Judge (05/05)

2.5 Renumbered

Where an application has been received from a Non Resident Judge who has previously been approved by their Country of Residence's Controlling Body to award Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent, in their Country of Residence, and are currently on an "inactive" list due to being employed by their Controlling Body, and their Country's Rules and Regulations prevent them from judging in their Country of Residence, they may be approved to judge in Australia, subject to:



- 2.3.1 The person has awarded Challenge Certificates, or their equivalent, in their Country of Residence within the previous ten [10] years, and;
- 2.3.2 The person has judged the breeds they are seeking approval for within the last three [3] years at a recognised show conducted under the auspice of a recognised Controlling Body.
- Judges who have moved their country of residence and are not approved to judge some or all the breeds in their new country of residence that they were approved to judge in their original country of residence, will be eligible to be approved by the ANKC Ltd to judge the breeds they were approved to judge in their original country of residence. Judges, who have been licenced by a neighbouring Country which is not their Country of Residence, shall be allowed to Judge on furnishing documentation from their Country of Residence and their Country of Licence. (05/05)
- 2.5 A Non Resident Judge approved on a provisional permit or apprentice basis is not eligible for approval to Judge at Championship Shows in Australia for those breeds or Groups subject to such provisional permit or apprenticeship.

2.8 Now not relevant, delete in its entirety

2.8. A Non-Resident Judge on their first judging assignment in Australia will not be permitted to judge more than four shows in one state/territory on his first tour.

Copies of Appendix A and B as referenced in the amendments above are attached to this summary.

These amendments will be effective from 1 January 2025.

8. National Junior Handler Final - Sponsorship

It was resolved that sponsorship as proposed by Moorholme Pet Transport for the National Junior Handler Final be endorsed.

9. ANZAC Day – War Memorial

It was resolved that ANKC Member Bodies be encouraged to place a wreath on their war memorial on Anzac Day in recognition of dogs and other animals that have served in the Australia Defence Force.

10. * Dogs Australia Rules - Amendment

Briards are a medium to large breed (58-69cm / 23-27in) similar in size and weight to a Old English Sheepdog or German Shepherd Dog. They are strong, muscular, extremely agile and supple with a long shaggy coat.

Usual colours are black (often with scattered white hairs through the coat), slate grey or various shades of fawn ranging from a pale cream to a deep rich gold. Fawn Briards may or may not have black muzzles and ear tips and often have varying amounts of black or grey shading across the neck and shoulders. The coat of an adult is 30cm or longer. Texture is slightly wavy and quite coarse (described as a goat like coat) with a medium undercoat. The tail is long with heavy feathering and hangs down low with an inverted 'J' shaped 'hook' at the end. The head is quite large and always with a black nose. Eyes should be dark and have a gentle expression 'with a depth that is moving to the beholder'. Ears are medium sized, hang down (i.e. not 'cropped' as they often are in USA) and very mobile and expressive. There should be ample beard and moustache hair and a long 'fringe' covering the eyes and ears - and yes - they can see through the gaps in the fringe!! A requirement for the breed ring is the presence of double dew-claws on the inside of each back foot, these should be as low to the ground as possible and in many dogs actually function as extra toes.

Briards can be expected to live to 12-13 years of age with a significant number living to 14 and some until they are 15. With very few exceptions they remain active and healthy with few signs of ageing until a sudden final illness overtakes them.

BREED HALLMARKS

Double dew claws on the rear feet and the 'shepherds crook' or crochet tail. The tail should never rise above the topline and should reach the hock.

BREED HISTORY

Country of Origin - France

Early tapestries of the eighth century depict these large shaggy dogs with the Emperor Charlemagne and in the eighteenth century Napoleon also had Briards to look after his flocks of sheep that went with him as food for his soldiers. He took them on his travels to Eastern Europe and Egypt (the Egyptian breed the 'Armant' is said to have come down from Napoleon's Briards). Unfortunately, shepherds were not renowned for their writing skills and little more is available during this time on the history of the Briard. In fact, it is from the United States of America that some of the early documentation comes. In 1789 the Frenchman, La Fayette, introduced Briards to Thomas Jefferson who became one of the first breeders in the USA. Jefferson was a man with a keen appreciation for the usefulness of dogs and of the Briard he wrote 'they are the finest house and farm dogs I have ever seen'.

Back in France in 1897 the first official description or "standard" governing the appearance of the Briard was drawn up by Le Club Francaise du Chien de Berger. The work of the herding dogs is so specialised that the work demands specific qualities of the body and spirit and especially attitude. These characteristics were defined in this early French Standard and revisions in 1908, 1924, 1925 have led to the current standard in France.





ORIGINAL PURPOSE

Like many working breeds, the Briard evolved over time. They were originally general-purpose farm dogs, bred to contain large flocks of heavily domesticated sheep. In the days prior to the industrial revolution fencing was highly unusual in France, and many shepherds did not own much land. The shepherd and the dogs would take the flocks out to graze, generally on common ground. The Briards would work the perimeter of the grazing area, forming a 'living fence' and containing the stock and ensuring that none strayed. They would also be expected to defend the flock from predators. Unlike livestock guardians they were not left alone with the flock, but always worked in the company of the shepherd. Once grazing was done for the day, they would steer the flock back to the evening holding area and then accompany the shepherd to his lodgings / house. There, they would be protector of the household.

The Briard has been the official dog of the French Army and is somewhat rare today because so many were lost in World War 1. They were used to carry supplies to the front lines and served as a sentry dog. Due to his keen hearing, reputed to be the most acute of any breed, he was used by the

medical corps to search for wounded soldiers. The reports stress the amazing ability of the Briard to lead the corpsmen to those men which still had a spark of life in their bodies. It was said that any man a Briard passed by was beyond assistance.

The Briard is not a breed created by modern zoology but rather is the natural descendant of man's first helper, the dog of pre-history. He has evolved through time by natural selection for the qualities needed in his work.

Today this dog of the plains is more elegant than he used to be, devoted breeders have kept him not too shaggy or too big and have retained all of his original characteristics, especially his alertness and his tractable temperament.

BEHAVIOUR CHARACTERISTICS

Briards are very intelligent – quick to learn but quick to take advantage of any lack of determination on the part of the owner. (You must be absolutely certain that they're not allowed on the bed or they'll keep pushing till you give in!!!) Described as 'gay and lively' – they enjoy life and show it – 'full-on'. They can and do spend time asleep tucked away in a corner when there is



nothing happening – but they are just conserving their energy for when it really matters! Extremely affectionate – they live for their owner's company and are happier lying at (or on!) your feet while you sit reading a book, than outside playing without you. They will follow you all through the house – even into the bathroom!! They are excellent guard-dogs without being vicious. With their acute hearing nothing gets by unnoticed (very reassuring if you are alone in the house at night!). They bark only as a warning, but when they do, both bark and growl are fearsome!

OWNERSHIP PREFERENCES

Adult Briards are amiable, tolerant and enjoy children of all ages and puppies are fine with children over 4 years old. Boisterous puppies however, can become too overwhelming for some pre-schoolers to cope with. This applies particularly when parents are on the steep learning curve of first-time large-dog ownership. In their home country of France they are often referred to as the 'babysitter dog' or the 'doormat' dog. Because a Briard's greatest enjoyment in life is to be with you, sharing in the family activities, he needs to be largely an indoor dog. The greatest cruelty you can inflict on a Briard is to keep him

shut outside 'missing out' when his family is at home. For such a boisterous dog they make excellent house dogs and are very quickly house trained.

HOUSING REQUIREMENTS


Briards need the company of 'their' humans so they are not a suitable breed to be kept permanently outside. If an outside run is required while owners are at work it needs to be at least 2m x 2m x 3m long with a roof and a snug kennel attached. Briards are naturally 'home' dogs – their home and family is the centre of their world so they are not inclined to wander, but they do still need secure fencing. This doesn't need to be a 2m high fortress but it must be puppy-proof from the outset.

GROOMING

The beautiful shaggy coat must obviously be cared for, but it's not as time consuming as you might think. You need to allow an hour or two once a week but if you miss a week it will take longer the following week. Briards don't have a thick undercoat and the top coat is almost straight and fairly coarse, so they are easier and quicker to groom than many other long coated







TRAINING

Briards learn most things quickly and easily provided you set limits and stick to them consistently. But as with any breed they will pick up bad habits just as easily if allowed. Although Briards can and have been trained for competitive Obedience and Agility, on occasion their innovative streak can produce interesting variations to standard exercises! They will NEVER become ring robots. It is strongly recommended that you take your Briard to Obedience School. They still retain very strong herding instincts and can successfully be trained to work sheep. (If there are no sheep available, they will herd duck, chickens, children - or anything else that comes to hand!) Herding as a dog sport is one way of keeping your Briard exercised. In France, many farms still use the Briard as the primary herding dog. Briards are happiest to be sharing your company whatever you are doing.



They will love long walks where they can explore ahead but continually return to 'check in' with their owners. As a bonus they can reliably be taught to come when they are called. They also enjoy being around water and most are tennis balls fanatics!!

UNDESIRABLE TRAITS TO BE WARNED ABOUT

Because Briards have been bred for centuries as watch-dogs on remote French farms, by nature they tend to be reserved with strangers. (Though once they have accepted and made friends with someone they will never forget.) To counteract this natural aloofness, Briard puppies must have plenty of 'socialising' while they are young. This will in no way lessen their effectiveness as guard-dogs. Puppy pre-school classes are an excellent way of starting the socialising process. A young Briard's exuberant display of affection (while welcomed by most owners) may seem overwhelming to some people who may be happier owning a quieter, less demonstrative breed.

BRIARDS AND PERFORMANCE SPORTS – AUSTRALIA

The Briard has a very good memory. Once a lesson is learned, good or bad, the knowledge will be retained for a long time to come. Sometimes they









may appear to be strong minded and stubborn, but these are a few of the Briards characteristics. They were bred for centuries to think for themselves and to act upon their conclusions, sometimes to the point of thinking what the flock will do ahead of time. This can be frustrating, but keeps training sessions interesting!

Like most working breeds Briards are eager to please and when training methods are positive, and the sessions kept lively, energetic, and interesting, the Briards natural intelligence will have him at the top of the class.

Unfortunately, not many compete in dog sports with their Briards. There have been 2 Dual Champions in the breed.

- **1.** Dual Ch (Herding) Cacharel Utzano HSAs HSCs HICs HXCs 'Moose' was bred, owned and trained by C and A Mitchell in Qld.
- **2.** Dual Ch (Tracking) Trilby Fitz The Bill CD RAE PT ET, 'Billy' was bred by Irena Schneider BVSc (NSW) and trained and trialled by Jessie Hughes and Lynne Webster in South Australia.

Other Briards have titled in Agility, Lure Coursing, Endurance, Rally, Tracking and Scentwork. They

have also competed admirably in a variety of the newer sports, such as Weight Pull (a Briard won the first event in Queensland), and SprintDog.

HEALTH

The Briard is overall a healthy breed, and many live to great ages. The longest we know of in Australia was 16 years 9 months. It is not uncommon for them to live healthy active lives until around 14 years. Responsible breeders screen their stock for health conditions such as hip and elbow dysplasia, congenital stationary night blindness and cataracts. Full DNA panels will give results of colours carried including the dilution gene and the Briard specific, eye disease CSNB (Congenital Stationary Night Blindness). Good breeders also do heart clearances.

Other health issues in the breed are bloat (Gastric Torsion) and Ectopic Ureter. Presently a couple of the overseas Breed Clubs are working to find a genetic marker and subsequently a test, to identify carriers of Ectopic Ureters.

Puppy Sale Contracts :





I often hear members say "I don't need a contract" and that "contracts are not worth the paper they are written on". Not true.

WHY SHOULD YOU USE A PUPPY SALE CONTRACT? What could possibly go wrong?

Many disputes arise because the agreement has not been properly documented. A contract sets out the terms of the arrangement. It is also a useful tool in managing expectations. If you do not document what has been agreed, then what is it that you have actually agreed to? And in the event that this turns into a dispute, if you have not documented what was agreed, how is anyone else supposed to figure that out? I often hear members say that it is all on email or Messenger. While this is at least in writing, this is far less than ideal and does not constitute an agreement. In the absence of a written agreement, there is a greater risk of assertions that further representations have been made (written or verbal). If things go sour, you will inevitably be in a better position if the agreement has been properly documented and signed by both parties.

Further, based on experience, the purchaser may only have selective hearing. This is a common problem with many forms of contract (being equally applicable to goods and services) and is definitely not limited to puppy/dog sales. Generally, the less sophisticated the purchaser, the more likely this is to be a problem. This is not necessarily deliberate and is understandable. Acquiring a puppy is a significant decision and often an emotive one. This may mean that the purchaser is not listening properly to what you say. While you may believe that you have explained everything clearly, the purchaser is likely to be far more focused on the puppy (let's face it – they are distracting) than the terms of sale. That is why




it is important to document the arrangement in writing. This is also why it is important to send the new owner home with written instructions on caring for their new puppy. Work on the assumption that they are not listening properly and are only actually hearing part of what you say as, in many cases, this is likely to be fairly accurate.

Both parties must do their due diligence. This is the case no matter what type of contract is involved. Ask questions of the puppy purchaser. This will assist in clarifying any issues upfront. If you don't like their answers or have real reservations, don't sell to them. Remember – you are not obliged to do so. While it is difficult in the current market, if you have reservations at the outset, it is often best to discontinue at that point and save yourself the grief.

If you are dealing with a more sophisticated

purchaser (such as another breeder, a person involved in conformation shows or sport), it is even more important to clarify expectations and deal with any issues upfront. It is by far better to do this at the outset as it rarely, if ever, gets any easier just more complicated. If you have concerns that they will abide by the terms of the contract, have it witnessed. However, if you don't trust them, it is usually better not to deal with them at all.

I also often hear – "We are friends." "We don't need a contract". No. This is even more reason to have a contract in order to avoid any misunderstanding of what is expected. The dog world is littered with stories of friendships which have ended badly over dogs. I have occasionally dealt with friends in which case, I say – because we are friends, it is even more important that we have a contract, as I would like us to stay friends. The contract should clearly set out the expectations of both parties. If this is documented, this will hopefully avoid or minimise the potential for future dispute. If not, you will at least have evidence to support your case. How is anyone else supposed to know what you actually agreed to if you do not document it.



A further factor is the passage of time. Issues usually arise a considerable amount of time later and, in some cases, many years down the track. Memory of what may have been said or promised/represented at the time will fade over time. Add to that, one or both parties may have a selective memory. There is also the possibility that issues may arise as a result of ill health and/or death of the owner. For example, if the puppy/dog is to be offered back to you first before it is sold/transferred, how do you prove that the new owner agreed to this at the time? If there is no contract, you are unlikely to have any prospect of persuading anyone (particularly, the executor of an estate or relatives) to transfer the dog back to you.

Ultimately, the failure or success of any contract depends on the parties themselves. If the other party behaves in a manner which is not trustworthy or has a history of doing so, you should ask yourself, why are you dealing with them?

AUSTRALIAN CONSUMER LAW

For the purpose of Australian Consumer Law, dogs are treated as property or chattels (no different to any other goods for sale). Therefore, the transaction constitutes a sale of goods. Accordingly, if the article is considered defective or faulty at the time of sale, the purchaser is entitled to a refund or replacement article. Clearly, when it comes to the sale of a puppy (or dog), this is not an inanimate object but a living being. So, this is not so simple as it is impossible to replace the puppy with an exact replica. So, clearly the best you can offer is an equivalent. Personally, I am not in favour of offering a replacement. Each puppy will be different and this may not be the right fit for the next puppy. It is usually simpler to take the puppy back, provide them with a refund and resolve this issue as soon as possible.

Further, if the purchaser is difficult and the relationship has gone sour, it is unlikely that you will wish to provide them with another puppy as you may not wish to deal with them again or possibly ever in this lifetime. If they have been difficult to deal with over the first puppy, it is highly likely that they will continue to be difficult to deal with. In these circumstances, the best advice is usually to take the puppy back, provide them with a refund of the purchase price and get rid of them.



WHAT COULD POSSIBLY GO WRONG?

Many disputes arise because there is nothing in writing. There may be allegations that the deal changed or that verbal representations/promises have been made. If there is no actual contract in writing, you are leaving yourself open to the potential for this.

DISPUTES – COMMON ISSUES WHICH GIVE RISE TO CONFLICT

Main v Limit Register

In most cases, confusion arises where this has not been properly documented. It should be clear whether the puppy is being sold on Main Register or Limit Register. To avoid confusion and any potential for dispute, this should be included in the contract. Further, Rule 21.1(5) (page 24) provides that if the puppy is being sold on Limit Register, the purchaser is required to acknowledge this by signing a Dogs Queensland Limited Register Agreement. This form is on the DQ website.

De-sexing

Unfortunately, this is one of the most difficult issues to address. These days, the general consensus is that desexing too early is less than ideal from a health perspective for developmental reasons, particularly for large breeds. Options which are sometimes used by breeders to encourage this include providing a voucher or refund on proof of desexing. The requirement to desex and appropriate age for this can be specified in the contract. However, the reality is that you cannot control what happens once the puppy has left your possession. The only way to ensure that

this occurs is to desex the puppy (or dog) before it leaves. In this case, there are the options of tubal ligation or vasectomy. If you do not believe in early desexing, then it is important to educate the purchaser. Unfortunately, enforcement of this clause is a real issue as the dog is their property and no longer under your control. You just have to trust that they will do the right thing.

Deposits and Waiting lists

Some breeders take deposits early. Some prefer to wait until later or not to take a deposit at all. This does provide greater flexibility in the event that you change your mind. Whatever you decide, once you take a deposit the purchaser will expect that the puppy is theirs and you will then have to manage that expectation. What if the purchaser fails to respond to further communication until you advise that you have decided to place the puppy elsewhere and they demand that they are still entitled to the puppy.

Generally, a deposit should be refundable. If you decide to make a deposit non-refundable for change of mind or even if you keep a percentage for administrative costs/expenses, this should be set out clearly in writing prior to payment of the deposit and acknowledged by the purchaser in writing. Otherwise, you will potentially have to deal with an argument over this.

This is yet another reason to use a contract. If you think about other contracts you enter into in life and pay a deposit upfront eg. a layby, building work, or most other contracts for goods and

services, you are provided with the paperwork to sign off on at the time that you pay the deposit. So, why would you not do this when selling a puppy?

There are additional considerations. If a person changes their mind and does not wish to proceed for whatever reason eg. they realise they made the wrong decision or perhaps due to change of circumstances, clearly it is not going to be the right home. Sometimes, you are usually better off to just refund the entire deposit and be rid of them. It is also important to bear in mind that circumstances change or it may become apparent that the home is not the right fit. Ultimately what is the best environment for the puppy is paramount.

Payment by Instalments

From time to time, a potential purchaser may ask you – Can I pay in instalments? While it is up to you to decide whether or not you would be prepared to accept payment on these terms, this in an area that is fraught with risk. Effectively, you are assuming all of the risk in the transaction. However, the risk may be more than simply whether or not the purchaser will default on payment and whether you will ever receive the balance of the purchase price.

Payment by instalments is usually proposed on the basis that the purchaser has difficulty affording the purchase price. However, other reasons may also be provided. Clearly, this may raise questions as to whether they can afford the ongoing expenses such as quality food, veterinary and other expenses. Ultimately, this is a question for the breeder to decide whether or not this is acceptable.

In many cases, this ends badly. There is a very high risk that the new owner will be slow to pay and/or default on payment altogether in which case you will be left unpaid and forced to pursue them. As this is usually a small claim, you will have to decide whether it is worth taking them to QCAT (which is typically a slow process) for the balance.

However, a word of warning – it can be much worse than this. This is why payment by instalments after the puppy has left your possession is a really bad idea.

Once there was a sweet puppy. He had an incorrect bite. So, the breeder decided to sell him as a pet. The potential purchaser pleaded poor. So, the breeder kindly took pity on her and allowed her to pay a deposit and take possession of the puppy with the balance to be paid by instalments. There was no contract in writing.

Not long after the purchaser took possession of the puppy, the breeder started to receive some strange messages complaining about the puppy which indicated that the new owner was having difficulty bonding. So, the breeder offered to take the puppy back. The new owner kept coming up with stories which delayed return. Allegations followed that the breeder had misled her about the bite (despite this having been disclosed in the vet report at the time of sale). According to her vet major surgery would be required at a very significant cost. The breeder's vet considered this completely unnecessary. Then came the allegations from the owner that she had been sold a "defective product" (very upsetting for any breeder) and the breeder should have to pay for the surgery. So, the new owner defaulted and refused to pay any more instalments. The breeder again offered to take the puppy back and refund the money paid to date. The owner refused on the basis that she had now become attached.

The breeder was left in the situation where only a deposit had been paid. As the new owner had possession of the puppy, the "goods" had been transferred so pursuant to property law, property had passed to the new owner. To add insult to injury, the new owner was now making a claim for sale of "defective goods". As the new owner was refusing to return the puppy and accept a refund, the breeder was left in a very difficult position. Further, Rule 28 (page 31) requires that the puppy be transferred to the new owner within 30 days. So, despite not having been paid the balance, the breeder was still obliged to transfer the puppy to the new owner within the requisite period.

While this is a worst case scenario, unfortunately this is a true story and very stressful for those involved. Unfortunately, this is by no means an isolated incident. There are many similar stories in canine contract discussion groups.

There is a high likelihood that the purchaser will default. Sometimes circumstances change and they have difficulty paying or just fail to pay because they believe that they will get away with it. Unfortunately, in some cases, you may be dealing

with a con artist. Accordingly, if anyone wishes to pay by instalment, I would either decline or specify that the price must be paid in full before the puppy leaves. Unless you know the person very well and sometimes even if you do, payment plans are best avoided due to the very significant risks involved. If you do decide to accept payment terms, the only way to protect yourself is if this is on the basis that payment has been made in full before the puppy is collected.

Health issues

Health issues, are clearly a potential area for conflict. This is a very difficult area as property and consumer law fails to deal with adequately with living beings.

Has there been full or adequate disclosure of any health issues? Is it a minor or a major health issue? Something a breeder may consider a minor issue, may be considered a major issue by the purchaser or a relevant issue in the purchasing decision. Lack of disclosure and/or understanding by the purchaser may lead to a mis-match in expectations. This may be exacerbated by the response of the new owner's vet. A good example of this type of mis-match is a case where the puppy had an umbilical hernia. While umbilical hernias are a common occurrence and the breeder presumably considered this a minor issue, particularly as the puppy was sold as a pet, the purchaser considered this a major issue, partly due to lack of disclosure by and/or discussion with the breeder and consequently lack of understanding

of what was involved to correct this. If the breeder had disclosed the umbilical hernia, then there would have been discussion about correcting the hernia at the time it was desexed. Instead the purchaser posted all over social media in one of the Facebook breed groups about how terrible the breeder was and breeders were generally and asking how to make the seller pay for the surgery. It was subsequently explained to the purchaser that this was a relatively minor issue and could be corrected relatively easily. However, if this had been explained at the time of sale (and also preferably in writing), it is far less likely that this would have been an issue. If this had been documented in some way either in the contract or in the associated documentation (eg. annexure, vet report, email prior to sale), this would have been preferable. If it was noted that the puppy has an umbilical hernia – there also would have been evidence of disclosure at the time of sale.

Given that we are dealing with a living creature, the list of potential health issues is long. So, it is impossible to cover them all. However, the same general principles apply. If the price has been discounted to allow for the issue, then it is better to have documented this. If not in the contract then at least in some form, such as vet reports at the time of sale.

Health issues, particularly those arising subsequent to the sale of a puppy, are probably the greatest area for risk for breeders. How long after the sale of a dog or puppy is the seller liable? Who





is responsible for veterinary expenses and to what extent? What if the purchaser's actions have caused or contributed to the health issue? There are also cases where the health issue appears to have been fabricated or over-exaggerated.

To some extent at least, a contract will provide a degree of protection against legal action and for this reason alone a contract is a good idea.

Return policy

What if the puppy or dog is returned after 3 days, 1 week, 6 months, 12 months or even as an adult dog? Dogs are not inanimate articles. They are living beings and not all health issues are genetic. Genetics 101: Genotype + Environment = Phenotype.

As is the case with any living being, puppies and dogs are subject to numerous environmental factors and influences which may have consequential effects upon the dogs health. Clearly, these factors and influences are beyond the breeder's control.

So, at what point, does the purchaser no longer receive a refund? Ultimately, this will be for the breeder to decide and, preferably, to specify this in the contract.

Health Guarantees and Insurance

Clauses regarding health, guarantees (if any) and

insurance should be carefully worded.

Personally, I would not offer any form of guarantee. I would explain that you are dealing with a live being and that there are no guarantees in life. All you can do is provide the vet reports and vaccination records which will indicate that the puppy was healthy at the time of sale and handover. What happens after that is out of your control.

You cannot contract out of Australian Consumer Law. Any attempt to do so will be null and void. However, there are steps you can take to assist in protecting yourself.

One way is to specify that the purchaser should organise their own vet check within say 48-72 hours. A further practical way to protect yourself is to take advantage of one of the insurance options which provide cover to the new owner for a period after the puppy leaves. In some cases, new owners may be reticent and/or delay taking a sick puppy to the vet which may lead to a far worse prognosis than might otherwise have occurred or sadly may be fatal. Insurance may assist in alleviating this concern for new owners. This is a good option to consider both in order to protect yourself and to ensure that the puppy receives veterinary attention within the period when it is most vulnerable after leaving your care.

CONCLUSION

In summary, generally, any contract or written agreement is better than none.

Most of us understand about setting our dogs up for success. So, why don't we apply the same principles to our contractual arrangements with dogs? Circumstances change. Memories fade. Some people have selective memories. People can change their minds over time for a multitude of reasons. Not everyone is trustworthy. Purchasers can be scammers too. It is better to anticipate and deal with potential issues early and, if necessary, have difficult discussions at the outset than end up in a dispute and potential legal action with all the stress and cost that this generally entails.

So, why should you use a puppy sale contract? My answer (for all of the above reasons) is – why wouldn't you?

Government & Media Liaison Committee Report

The purpose of this Committee is to deal with legislative and regulatory issues as they arise and to keep members informed of proposed changes which could impact upon their activities, particularly with respect to animal welfare and animal management. The focus has therefore been on tackling proposed legislative/regulatory amendments.

Specific activities of members of this Committee together with members of the DQ Executive, our General Manager and Canine Welfare Officer have included:

Proposed amendments to Agriculture and Fisheries and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2023 – Dangerous/Aggressive Dogs & Breed specific legislation (BSL) aka banning specific breeds

 Reporting to members on proposed changes, meetings with external stakeholders regarding proposed amendments to the legislation, also communications with Council officers to obtain their perspective and input on animal management issues, preparing and filing submissions to the Queensland Parliament State Development and Regional Industries Committee, navigating our way around floodwaters in order to appear before the State Parliamentary Committee Hearing, report to members on the State Parliamentary Committee report, as well as a number of television (Channel 7, 9 and 10) and radio interviews (ABC Radio) with respect to the above.

<u>Proposed amendments to the Breeder Code</u> governing animal welfare in Queensland

 Meetings with external stakeholders regarding breeding and other animal welfare issues.

It is encouraging to see that as a result of our work over the last few years, Dogs Queensland is being viewed as an important stakeholder by both government and media and invited to participate in the above.

We look forward to continuing to advocate on behalf of our organisation and the interests of members going forward. We are also continuing to work with contacts within government and other external stakeholders.

Do you know... Rule 21: Obligation To Register

- 21.1 A member who breeds a litter of dogs, the parents of which are registered or eligible for registration with the CCCQ Ltd or other recognised canine controlling body must:
 - (1) Register such litter, including all of the living progeny in such litter at one (1) and the same time within eighteen (18) calendar months of the date of whelping or prior to sale or rehoming (see Rule 28). No litter will be registered after twelve (12) months of age without the approval of the CCCQ Ltd;
 - (2) Comply with CCCQ Ltd Rules and correctly complete all forms required by the CCCQ Ltd;
 - (3) Pay such fees as are determined from time to time by the CCCQ Ltd. A standard fee will be set for registrations received by the office on a date within four (4) months of the date of whelping and a higher fee for registrations received by the office on a date between four (4) and six (6) months or between six (6) and twelve (12) months of the date of whelping;
 - (4) Where the breeder wishes to register a puppy with the breeder's name as part owner, an Agreement signed by the purchaser of the puppy is to be attached to the application to register the litter. Only official CCCQ Ltd Partnership Agreement forms are to be used;
 - (5) Where the breeder wishes to register a puppy on the Limited Register, an Official CCCQ Ltd Limited Register Agreement statement from the purchaser stating that the implications of the Limited Register are understood is to be attached to the application; and
 - (6) A breeder may, at time of registration on the General Register, endorse registration "Not to be exported".



Canine Health Committee Report


It has been a busy time for the Canine Health Committee.

Earlier in the year (April 2024), the Committee organised training for veterinary practitioners in conducting respiratory function grading assessments to assist in rolling out the respiratory function grading scheme in Australia. This was well attended and included veterinary practitioners from around Queensland, other Australian States and Territories, as well as Singapore and the USA. It was important for our Committee to make this scheme available to our members in Queensland at least partly due to the increasing pressure from external stakeholders both within Australia and overseas to address concerns about brachycephalic dogs. The scheme enables dogs to be assessed prior to breeding with a view to improving the overall health of breeding stock.

This is an important tool for our breeders and should ultimately lead to the betterment of brachycephalic breeds. This is also useful in assessing whether surgery may be required where there is a concern with respect to any particular dog. Hopefully, these assessments will also assist in avoiding unnecessary surgery.

Over the course of the year, the Canine Health Committee has hosted webinars, seminars and workshops on a range of topics including aromatherapy for canines, nutrition, breed surveys, utilisation of DNA health testing as a tool in developing strategies for reducing inherited diseases, hip dysplasia, chiari malformation (CM), syringomyelia (SM) and primary secretory otitis media (PSOM). Members of the Committee have also attended external webinars on other issues of significant concern.

The Canine Health Committee also recently held





a TTouch workshop. TTouch techniques are particularly useful in reducing stress, fear and anxiety, improved behaviour, pain relief, support for aging dogs with mobility issues and comfort.

Next year, there will be more to look forward to. We have a number of seminars already lined up. We are working on further seminars, webinars and workshops for 2025 as well as reintroducing a heart and eye clinic. So, watch this space.

The Committee has also been working with James Cook University on a number of important canine health research projects. These have included a prevalence study of canine herpesvirus in breeding dogs and the community, and establishing the prevalence of vector borne pathogens in dogs in North Queensland (Ehrlichia canis, Babesia canis, Babesia vogeli and Dirofilaria immitis [heartworm]). These projects have been funded by Dogs Queensland. We look forward to working on further research projects to advance canine health in the future.

Addressing some of the greatest threats to our

dogs and breeds has been a priority this year. Hopefully, we have made significant progress in working towards our goals of the betterment of our breeds and improving the health and wellbeing of all dogs.

I would like to thank the committee for their dedication to addressing health issues and to all of those members involved in or associated with the committee who have assisted over the course of the year in the planning, organising and running of these events. It takes a team to make this happen.

Let's Talk Transfers

Transferring a dog's pedigree is essential for the growth of Dogs Queensland and to promote the benefits of owning a pedigree dog. Over the last several months we have been contacting members to review their list of dogs currently recorded on the ANKC Database and to update any records that are incorrect. We appreciate the enthusiasm many members have shown to actively update their records and adjusting how they will manage transfers in the future to prevent this from re-occurring.

Under Dogs Queensland Rules (Seciton 28.1), it is the breeder's/current owner's responsibility to complete the pedigree transfer and pay the appropriate fee and, it must occur within 30 days of being sold, gifted, leased or exchanged.

This means a pedigree transfer is required when:

- Selling the dog to another Dogs Australia member
- Selling the dog to a pet only home (even if the new owner does not want the pedigree)
- Selling or gifting to a friend or family member
- When rehoming an older dog after retirement

For a simple pedigree transfer where the dog has no conditions of sale (e.g. Limited Register, Not for Breeding, Not for Export etc), only you as the breeder/current owner need to sign the back of the pedigree and include the new owner details and submit it to Dogs Queensland with the appropriate

fee. The new owner does not need to sign the pedigree.

If there are conditions on the dog (e.g. Limited Register, Not for Breeding, Not for Export etc) then both you as the breeder/current owner and the new owner are required to sign the pedigree and it is to be sent in by you with any supporting documentation and the appropriate fee.

During the record update process, we have received queries around how to manage dogs that are not living with you but are a part of your breeding/showing program or waiting for confirmation of desexing. These circumstances can be handled in the following way and meet Dogs Queensland Rule requirements:


- Dog being used as part of your breeding program or awaiting health test results to determine future use of the dog – The pedigree must be transferred to the new owner within 30 days of the dog changing owners and if/when the dog is required for breeding or showing, the new owner can lease the dog back to you for the required time. The new owner does not need to be a member of Dogs Queensland to enter into a lease agreement. Lease agreements can be completed on the back of the Pedigree.
- Breeders awaiting confirmation of desexing before transferring the pedigree

 If you are concerned the dog may be bred from, put the dog in a partnership, sell the dog desexed or enquire about sterilisation options before sale to prevent unplanned breeding. This may need to be factored into your selling price but ensures the dog can't be bred from.

It needs to be highlighted that throughout this record update process we are encouraging members to record dogs correct ownership status including when they are deceased. We have had some records returned that are not depicting the correct action for a dog record. Some examples are as follows:

- Marking dogs born after 1/1/2019 as deceased when microchip details have been updated to a new owner and the dog is alive. This may be to avoid paying the transfer fee however, this fee should have been paid at the time the dog was sold.
- Refusal to pay the transfer fee when the new





owner details are not known. These records should be kept and at the time the dog was sold, these details would have been known. Not having records for dogs you have sold indicate that you may need to review how you keep and store records.

Keeping dogs in their name as they are part
of their breeding or showing program but the
dogs are owned by another person. A transfer
is required in this instance. The dog can be
leased back to you for breeding and showing
requirements.

If it is found that the information that has been provided is not a true reflection of the dog's current status, further enquires will be made.

Once this review process is complete and to provide further support to members in record reviews, Dogs Queensland will be sending annual reminders for dog numbers recorded under Breeder Prefixes so missed record updates can be identified earlier and corrected.

NUTRITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR YOUR BREEDING BITCH DURING GESTATION

WHAT. WHEN & WHY

From the moment a puppy is conceived, all throughout their life, nutrition plays a vital role. Nutritional requirements do vary and change with age, breed, life stage and lifestyle. Reproductive status also needs to be considered as pregnant bitches have very specific needs for their health and the health of their unborn puppies.

There are two distinct phases to a bitch's roughly 63-day gestation. Firstly, we have the embryonic phase for the first two thirds (6 weeks) of the gestation period. In this time, the cells of the embryo differentiate to form nerves, blood cells, skin cells, muscle cells, etc. The final trimester of gestation (week 6-9) is the foetal phase where rapid growth occurs in the foetus. These two phases have different nutritional requirements that need to be met, for the bitch to remain healthy and avoid whelping and neonatal problems down the track.

The energy requirements of the bitch in the first stage remain relatively unchanged. In the second stage, after day 42, there is a marked increase in energy requirements as this corresponds with marked foetal growth, while lactation has the highest demand for energy.

If the bitch if fed too much energy, and becomes overweight, this can be implicated in such problems from infertility, as well as whelping complications such as poor uterine contractility and an increased risk of a caesarean requirement. This dystocia can in turn lead to increased neonatal mortality.

It is important to ensure the body condition score of bitches remains ideal (4-5/9 BCS) during heat and gestation to help avoid this. Bitches should be regularly monitored throughout pregnancy for BCS to ensure their nutrition is adequate but not excessive.

There are specific nutrients that are critical for fertility, embryonic and foetal development, as well as neonatal health once born.

Folic acid is a B Group Vitamin important for the development of the nervous system. During embryonic development, folic acid requirements significantly increase. Deficiency can easily develop in the bitch if she does not receive adequate amounts, which can lead to increases in the risk of neural tube defects such as cleft palate, the most common congenital abnormality in puppies as well as dystocia.

A cleft palate occurs due to a failure of the roof of the mouth to close during development in the womb. This results in a hole between the mouth and the nasal cavity. Normally the palate will close around day 35, so supplementation needs to occur prior to this preferably from as soon as the bitch comes into heat. Studies have shown that folic acid supplementation during embryo development, significantly reduces the risk of cleft palate incidence.

Omega 3 fatty acids such as DHA (docosahexaenoic acid) and EPA (Eicosapentaenoic acid) are very important nutrients for

many functions in the body, including reproduction. These fatty acids are critical in the growth and development of the central nervous system, as well as vision for the embryo and foetus. Studies in puppies have also demonstrated a beneficial effect on learning abilities and cognitive function (trainability) with DHA supplementation. These important nutrients can also assist with the digestive and immune functions.

Antioxidants are another important component when considering diet as they can protect against cell damage and include vitamins C, & E, Lutein and Taurine. Beta-carotene, also with antioxidant potential, can protect the DNA and tissues, as a precursor to Vitamin A has important functions for embryo nerve, muscle and skin development. They are also thought to have a role in progesterone secretion, preparing the uterus for implantation as well as helping to maintain gestation.

An important aspect to consider with nutrition in pregnancy is **palatability** as pregnant bitches often go off their food. They may require digestive support in the form of a highly digestible diet, with a balance of fibres to support optimal gut health and function, that provides all the required energy and nutrition tailored for pregnancy as well as high palatability for bitches who may be experiencing some inappetence that may be associated with hormonal changes.

To avoid any further digestive upsets, we always suggest a gradual transition from one diet to another over 7 days, which is why the recommendation for Starter diets will appear earlier at day 35 (a week before day 42).


We recommend a tailored diet specially formulated for breeding bitches from heat to day 42 of pregnancy where the bitch should then be transitioned on to a Starter diet for the last trimester



Royal Canin HT42D (named because of the time it is recommended to feed) is specifically formulated for Breeding adult breeding bitches over 10 kg from the 1st day of heat to the 42nd day of gestation.

HT42D is formulated for Reproductive health with a unique nutritional profile to meet bitch reproductive cycle 1st stage needs: from heat to 42nd day of gestation. It contains added betacarotene to help prepare the bitch for optimal reproductive performance. Enhanced folic acid and fatty acids to support healthy embryo and fœtal development, and appropriate energy content.

The puppies brain development can be assisted due also to the enriched DHA, an omega-3 fatty acid, which is scientifically proven to support a puppy's brain and visual development during gestation. Combination of prebiotics & highly digestible proteins help to promote a healthy balance of intestinal microbiota for digestive health & microbiome support.



SUMMARY

- Body weight of the pregnant bitch should not change much in the first 42days.
- Puppies gain 70% of their weight in the last trimester, this is when the bitch needs increased energy density in the diet
- Energy requirement will increase by about 10%each week in the final trimester.
- At the time of whelping, the bitches body weight should have increased by 15-25%.
- Food intake becomes limited as the growing uterus compresses the stomach; in the final trimester it is recommended to switch to a "Royal Canin Starter diet."
- An adult maintenance diet should not be fed during gestation as there will be energy and other nutrient deficiencies, however a growth or Starter diet fed for the whole pregnancy will lead to excess energy and fat accumulation.
- Lactation is the only stage where ad lib feeding is recommended for the bitch to accommodate for the enormous energy expenditure in this reproductive phase.


ROBYNNE TRAINOR:

On the weekend of 25-27 October 2024, many teams from throughout Queensland and interstate gathered at the Mudgeeraba Showgrounds on the Gold Coast to participate in the Dogs Queensland Scent Work State Titles competition. The weather obligingly cooled off just in time for the event and the new and exciting venue provided novel search areas. Judges from Queensland and Interstate officiated approximately 750 searches across the three days of competition.

Searches were conducted across all four elements – Containers, Interior, Exterior and Vehicles – and from Novice class up to Masters, and for the first time in 2024 including the Above: Bozzie, Australian Shepherd – Winner of the Ultimate Class. Image: Tell Tail Photography

newly-developed Ultimate Class.

Showcasing the high level of skill and teamwork amongst those at the highest level of competition, there were 36 entries in the Ultimate class, which is the largest entry in Australia to date.

Ultimate class requires teams to find an unknown number of hides and target odours between four (4) and ten (10); the search will include a minimum of three (3) elements in a search area between 200m² and 500m² and with search times between seven (7) and fifteen (15) minutes. Teams must ignore a variety of distractions in

challenging search configurations including "blank" areas, and areas containing challenging scent puzzles within the allocated search time. There were three qualifiers amongst the entry in what was a fun and challenging search set by interstate judge Sonja Needs (Vic).

Many teams achieved Element Titles in Container, Interior, Exterior and Vehicle elements, in addition to Scent Work Novice, Advanced, Excellent and Master Class titles. Congratulations to everyone who competed over the massive weekend of Scent Work fun!

ABOUT SCENT WORK

Scent Work is a sport that is based on the task of working detection dogs to locate an odour and communicate to the handler that the odour has been found. Detection is done in a variety of environments and often during changing weather or environmental conditions.

Scent Work is a positive, challenging activity that allows dogs the opportunity to use their strongest natural sense in a way that is fun, engaging, and builds and strengthens a foundation of trust between the handler and dog.


Dogs are trained to recognise specific odours, and to alert their handlers when the odours are detected. The dog and handler must work together as a team, using body language and verbal encouragement to ensure all sections of the search area are covered, directing the dog's search only when necessary and indicating to the Judge when the dog has found the odour.

Communication with and praise of the dog during the search are encouraged.



Breeder Alert – Puppy Scam Websites

Dogs Queensland has become increasingly aware of Puppy Scam Websites using legitimate Dogs Queensland Registration and Queensland Breeder Identification (BIN) Numbers to sell puppies. Dogs Queensland Registration Numbers are obtained from legitimate websites such as Dogs Queensland or DogzOnline, where they are displayed as required by the Queensland Government.

Please see the <u>Queensland Dog Breeder Fact Sheets</u> for regulations and guidelines for Queensland Dog Breeders.

An example of a typical scam is:

- A Dogs Queensland Membership number is lifted from current advertising on the internet.
- The scammer researches and obtains personal details of the breeder including name, suburb, prefix.
- A domain name similar to the Kennel prefix is registered on an offshore registry.
- Once the breeder has ceased advertising the litter of puppies a new website is published.
- No physical address or phone numbers are advertised on the website.
- The seller avoids permitting you to physically see the cyber puppy and only sends non genuine pictures.
- The seller insists on only accepting payment by a crypto currency or a funds transfer.

As a breeder what can you do to avoid being an unknowing victim of a Puppy Scam:

- Regularly Google search the internet for websites using a similar Domain Name as your Prefix.
- Put a warning notification in your online advertising to alert buyers to check any website they are looking at is legitimate.
- Encourage puppy buyers to verify breeder information with Dogs Queensland and make direct in-person contact with you.
- Ensure puppy buyers check communications are made with verified contact details.
- Encourage puppy buyers to meet the puppy and breeder before handing over payments.

Chewie and his sister Maggie first started competing in Lure Coursing a few years ago. They loved chasing down those naughty trash bunnies.

Both Chewie and Maggie have achieved the highest Lure Coursing title available to date of Coursing Ability Master.

Chewie and Maggie have also won several awards over the year such as Associate Coursing Ability King and Associate Coursing Ability Queen (Queensland Sighthound Association Inc and American Staffordshire Terrier Club of QLD Inc). Chewie has also won the highest Coursing Ability Dog trophy with Brisbane Lure Coursing Club and last year Chewie took home the Associate/Sporting Coursing Ability Dog of the Year for Lure Coursing (donated by the SprintDog Club of Qld Inc).

The Lure Coursing, SprintDog[™] and Weight Pull communities have benefited not only in watching the dogs enjoy the sports, but Penny has been at every trial, taking photos and providing them free of charge to exhibitors.

With the need of a dedicated track being built for SprintDog[™], we approached Penny and asked if she would be willing to charge a small price for the photos and videos and the proceeds going towards building the track – Penny was more than willing. Penny has also helped with fundraising for the Dogs ACT SprintDog Committee through videos.

ANKC HERDING

WHAT IS HERDING?

In a nutshell it is THE best fun you can have with your dog! Most herding dogs love the activity and the exercise. They enjoy moving stock around from place to place and it is an activity that creates a very special bond between handler and dog. When the lightbulb goes on for the dog it is a very special moment – hundreds of years of instinct and original purpose have come to light!

The ANKC herding program was developed to preserve the traditional style and herding instinct of the herding breeds. Working style differs from breed to breed and also within breeds. Different styles of work developed in response to local situations and needs. For instance, many of the European breeds work the furrow lines left by the plough to contain sheep within a graze area. This is very different to how the Kelpie or Border Collies work, but it is just as important to retain the original purpose for all breeds.

It is a sport enjoyed, not only by preservation breeders endeavouring to retain the original instincts, but by the pet owner who wants to expand their dogs horizons and challenge themselves, and the dog sport enthusiasts who like to try all different sports with their dogs.

The ANKC herding movement was started

in Victoria, and shortly after in 2002, enthusiasts from Queensland banded together to hold clinics and subsequently Herding Tests and Trials.

ANKC herding is a skills-based learning program and is divided into different levels, the first 3 levels are 'Test classes' – HIC, HT and PT. Once a PT (Pre Trial level) has been awarded, a dog may then compete at Trial level. There are 3 trial courses: A, B and C. Each of these courses is meant to represent the work traditionally done by the many different breeds eligible for ANKC Herding. Handlers can choose to compete on any course offered by the club holding the trial. Depending on the course, the numbers of stock range for 3 – 5 on A and B courses (sheep, ducks & cattle) and 25 – 100 (sheep only) on course C. Stock used in Queensland is primarily sheep, with some duck availability. Some of the smaller breeds, for example Corgis and Shetland Sheepdogs, have taken well to ducks. To date, no cattle trials have been offered in Queensland. The ANKC program has been through several revamps over the years, and first offered the 3 courses in 2007. Queensland was the first state in 2008 to offer competitors all 3 courses. It is hoped that in the near future, the FCI herding program will also be available. This program offers courses that are not 'set' so they really show the versatility of the dogs.

Safety of the stock and of the dogs is taken very seriously. The stock is ALWAYS 'Dog Broke' which means that sheep, ducks or cattle are used to being worked by a large variety of breeds. It must be remembered that not all breeds were bred to work 'wild' stock . Some breeds are traditionally fetching dogs, that is bring the stock to the handler, while others are driving dogs who take the stock from the handler. Many of the European breeds

are tending breeds and traditionally work very closely to large numbers of stock. The ANKC program is meant to accommodate all these breeds, plus some cross breeds from herding breeds.

If you have a cross breed or a dog without papers, the dog can

go on the Associate Register. For this register they must be desexed. If your dog is a mixture of Herding Breeds, that is Border Collie / Cattle Dog it can go on the Associate Register Herding (ARH). You will need to include an assessment form signed by your Herding Instructor, and your dog will also need to be desexed. There is also a Sporting Register for dogs already registered with another Association such as the Working Kelpie Council – these dogs go on the Sporting Register.

Herding is one dog sport where initially the dog will know far more than the handler. It can be very humbling watching your dog take charge and you not really know what is going on. The learning curve for the handler can be very steep and very, very challenging. No two sessions will ever be the same as the livestock will react differently each and

every time. Time and patience are needed to move forward in herding. It is a true partnership as the handler must learn to trust their dog.

The herding season in Queensland is quite short, due to our heat. The official season runs from March through to October.

Herding Championships are among the toughest Championships to gain. The first Herding Champion in Queensland was the Border Collie owned and trained by Tracey Lamb – Fidelis Mad about Ewe HXAs HSBd.

The second HCH and first Dual Champion (H) in Queensland was the Briard Ch Cacharel Utzano HSAs HSCs HICs HXCs owned, bred and trained by C and A Mitchell. To date, there has only been two Dual CH's from herding in Queensland.

Calling All BSD Breed Enthusiasts!

As the Breed Health Coordinator for the Belgian Shepherd Dog Club of Queensland (BSDCQ), I'm conducting research to better understand the behaviour and temperament of our beloved breed.

To do this, I am using the Canine Behavioral Assessment & Research Questionnaire (C-BARQ), a tool that provides invaluable insights into canine behaviour.



Your participation will contribute to the development of a comprehensive BSDCQ health plan for the breed. By participating, you'll help us gain a deeper understanding of common behavioural traits, which will support better breeding and socialisation/training strategies.

TO TAKE PART:

- 1. Go to www.cbarq.org.
- 2. If you've used the C-BARQ site before, you can click the "Log In" button to sign in.
- 3. If you're new to the C-BARQ, you can click the "Sign Up Today" button to create a profile before adding your BSD.

- 5. First, choose "Referred by a breeder or breed group" from the list of options.
- 6. On the next page, select the group BSDCQ.
- 7. After you've selected the group, enter the group's access code: 554709.
- 8. When you have finished adding your dog, you will be taken directly to the C-BARQ evaluation.



Once completed you will be able to see your dogs report, which will be collated anonymously to provide an overview for the research outcomes. There's plenty of time to take part as the group will be open until 31 December 2024.

A copy of the final research paper and the BSDCQ health plan will be made widely available in early 2025.




