Objectives: To lead the most advanced training program in Australia for new Judges and to support ongoing training of existing Judges so that Queensland Agility Judges are recognised as leaders in the sport.

Panel member pre-requisites:

- be a current Qld ANKC Agility Judge,
- complete the expression of interest form and return to Dogs Qld.

Panel format and activities: The Agility Judges Training Panel (AJTP) will comprise of 2 to 4 members who are current Qld ANKC Judges. It will deliver the Qld Agility Judges Training Program under the oversight of the Dogs Queensland Agility Sub-Committee. The responsibilities of the AJTP members may include:

- assessing applications to join the training program,
- developing new training material as part of the program curriculum,
- delivering or supporting the delivery of judges training modules as described in the Agility Judges Training Program,
- reviewing and assessing trainee exercises and providing constructive feedback (e.g. course maps, practical exercises),
- mentoring trainees during and after the training program (in agreement with mentees),
- assessing written and practical examinations for trainees,
- making recommendations to the Sub-Committee for development opportunities.

The term of membership on the AJTP is two years, after which serving members must nominate again. Following an expression of interest process, the AJTP members will be selected by the Agility Sub-Committee by vote.

The AJTP should meet at least twice a year (by online meeting or in person) to discuss trainee intake, progress, ideas and concerns. The AJTP may seek advice from the Agility Sub-Committee and / or the DQ Dog Sports Committee for specific topics.
