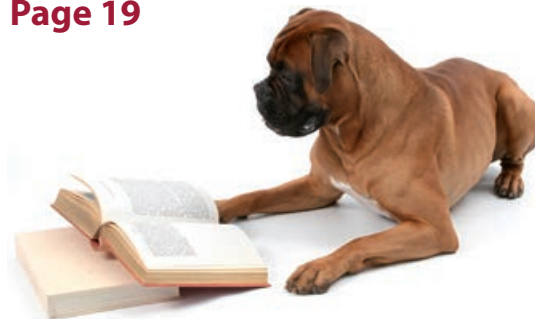

Puppy Farming Legislation

Dogs Queensland is still working very hard with the Queensland Government to seek an exemption for its members from the proposed State puppy farming legislation. Members of the executive, Rob Harrison and Mark Sheppard have again met with senior officials of the Queensland Government to discuss and agree on what needs to be done to achieve and implement concessions for the members of Dogs Queensland. We will continue to keep members up to date on any progress as it unfolds. We are working very hard to protect the rights of our membership.

Camping at Durack

Just an update on my October Message, on Monday 28 October we lodged with Brisbane City Council a development application to allow RV and Caravan Camping on the Durack Grounds. The Board, through Nick Holt from Town Planners, Norris, Clarke and O'Brien, were able to negotiate a 50% discount on the \$30,000 application fee, a saving of \$15,000. As reported previously, it is envisaged that this approval will take 3 - 6 months, I thank you all for your continued patience.

Social Media Policy

In the coming weeks, the Dogs Queensland Social Media Policy will be released. All members are encouraged to read the policy, and make sure they understand their obligations when using social media and information technology. Any feedback from members about the policy will be welcomed.

As a final note, I would like to advise members of legal action that Dogs Queensland is currently undertaking against a former member of our organisation. This person made comments on social media which were outright lies about a Director of our Board. The Board takes these matters very seriously, and matters of this nature will not be tolerated.

2016 Rally Obedience Rules – Titles

As a result of the Board endorsement of the 2015 National Obedience and Tracking Committee meeting minutes we refer all Member Bodies to the following extract (Page 5) from the Rules for the Conduct of Rally Obedience Trials relating to Titles which will be implemented from 1 January 2016. Please note that a numerical RAE Title may be completed in 2016 in accordance with the following:

NOTE: As from the 1st January 2016 the numeric designation to indicate the number of times the dog has met the RAE requirements will cease.

However where a dog has already attained one or more qualifying scores of 80 points or more in both the Rally Advanced B and Rally Excellent B Classes on the same day towards a numeric designation for a RAE title (eg RAE2) under the former Rules, these qualifications will be accepted towards the required total of five (5) double qualifying scores, provided that at least one double qualifying score of 80 points or more must be attained after these Rules become effective.

Titles

Only the highest Rally Obedience Title awarded to the dog will be used after the name of the dog or in the case of Rally Champion before the name of the dog. However Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE) and Rally Master (RM) Titles may appear together after the name of the dog.

Applications for RN, RA, RE, and RAE titles must be lodged indicating qualifying scores under at least two (2) different Judges.

Applications for RM and RO Ch titles must be lodged indicating qualifying scores under at least three (3) different Judges.

The Member Body will receive applications for the title "Dual Champion" in connection with each dog which, having gained its title of Conformation Ch. and Rally Obedience Champion (R.O. Ch.)

Class Titles and Qualifying Performance:

All dogs eligible to be entered in Rally Obedience Trials in accordance with these Rules shall be eligible to receive Class Title Certificates upon qualification and application.

The Member Body will receive applications for the use of the letters:

R.N. – signifying Rally Novice - Three (3) qualifying scores of 75 points or more must be earned under at least two different Judges in Novice class to earn a title.

R.A. – signifying Rally Advanced - Three (3) qualifying scores of 80 points or more must be earned under at least two different judges in Advanced Class to earn a title.

R.E. – signifying Rally Excellent - Five (5) qualifying scores of 80 points or more must be earned under at least two different Judges in Excellent class to earn a title.

R.A.E. – signifying Rally Advanced Excellent - To qualify for the title of RAE a dog and Handler team must receive a minimum of five (5) qualifying scores, in both the Rally Advanced B & Rally Excellent B Classes on the same day, of 80 points or more out of a possible perfect score of 100, under at least two different Judges.

However for a period of twelve (12) months from the date when these Rules become effective, where a dog has already attained one or more qualifying scores of 80 points or more in both the Rally Advanced B and Rally Excellent B Classes on the same day towards a RAE title under the former Rules, these qualifications will be accepted towards the required total of five (5) double qualifying scores, provided that at least one double qualifying score of 80 points or more must be attained after these Rules become effective.

R.M. – signifying Rally Master - Seven (7) qualifying scores of 85 points or more must be earned under at least three different judges in Master class to earn a title.

RO. CH - signifying Rally Obedience Champion - Upon having been granted the Rally Master Title, in order to receive the RO.CH Title, a dog must qualify a further ten (10) times with qualifying scores of 90 or more points in the Rally Master Class under at least (3) different Judges.



APPROVAL OF ELECTRONIC MOTION #120 - CHANGE OF GROUP - PERUVIAN HAIRLESS DOG

In accordance with the approved motion this breed will be moved from Group 7 (Non Sporting) to Group 4 (Hounds) from 1st January 2016.

The Group listing and website will be updated at that time.

AMENDMENT TO FCI BREED STANDARD - GERMAN SHEPHERD DOG & GERMAN SHEPHERD DOG (LSC)

As a result of advice received from the German Shepherd Dog Council (Australia) and after consultation with the National Breed Standards Coordination Group Chairperson Marie Merchant, the breed standards for the German Shepherd Dog & German Shepherd Dog (LSC) on the ANKC Ltd website will be amended as follows.

HEADING CURRENTLY READS:

FCI Standard No 166 dated 23 March 1991

HEADING TO BE AMENDED TO READ:

FCI Standard No 166 dated 23 December 2010

ADD TO BODY SECTION:

Skin: The skin is (loosely) fitting however without any folds.

FAULTS CURRENTLY READS:

k) Longcoat: Long, soft top coat without undercoat, usually with a parting down the middle of the back, flags on ears and legs and tail.

FAULTS TO BE AMENDED TO READ:

k) Long Stock Coat without undercoat.

l) Long Coat: Long, soft top coat without undercoat, usually with a parting down the middle of the back, flags on ears and legs and tails.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF NATIONAL AGILITY TEAMS EVENTS EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2016 – CORRECTION

It has been brought to our attention that the copy of the Rules for the Conduct of National Agility Teams Events effective from 1st January 2016 provided to us for publication on our website is incomplete.

The following **highlighted** text was omitted from Page 3:

- **Tied Results:** Where the **Total Faults** for two or more teams are equal the winner will be determined by the following analysis:-

1. The team with the least Total Course Faults from both Trials.

If they are still equal:

2. The team with the lowest Total Course Time from both Trials.

APPROVAL OF 2018 NATIONAL SHOW APPLICATION - GERMAN SHEPHERD DOG CLUB OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

We are pleased to advise the approval of the 2018 National Show/ Restricted Obedience Trial application received from the German Shepherd Dog Club of South Australia via Dogs SA to be held on 27th to 29th April 2018 at the German Shepherd Dog Club of South Australia Club Grounds, Pedigree Park, West Beach Road, West Beach. South Australia.

APPROVAL OF 2016 NATIONAL SHOW - OLD ENGLISH SHEEPDOG CLUB OF VICTORIA INC

We are pleased to advise the approval of the 2016 National Show application received from the Old English Sheepdog Club of Victoria Inc via Dogs Victoria to be held on 29th October 2016 at KCC Park, Cranbourne, Victoria.

RULE AMENDMENTS

The following Rules have been amended as a result of decision made by ANKC and are included in the amendments document on the Dogs Queensland Website:

36g. (i) – added the words that are underlined

all progeny of a litter (eight (8) weeks of age or over) submitted for registration must be positively identified by permanent Microchip (PPID) and recorded on a recognised Registry within Australia.

109A – f. rewritten, g. deleted and h. renumbered to g.

f. that the CCC(Q) shall grant reciprocal rights to a financial member of a State Controlling Body in regard to the sole ownership of a dog that resides in another State for exhibition and competition purposes without requiring the dog to be transferred to a resident member of the CCC(Q).

The registered owner of the dog must submit a Letter of Authority to the CCC(Q) authorising the handler, who shall be a financial member of the CCC(Q) to complete entry forms and to be responsible for the dog whilst in that State.

g. if any of the above conditions are breached the CCC(Q) in its absolute discretion may take whatever action they consider appropriate including but not limited thereto the cancellation of all challenge points won by the dog.

122r – added

Where “Double Handling” of exhibits is permitted at breed specialty and/or shows where exhibits are shown according to a specialist manner: the following clause must be included in the Show Schedule:

“Double Handling of Insert name of Breed is permitted at this Show”.

146A - added

At any Championship Show approved by the CCC(Q), no more than one (1) Judge shall be appointed to judge or adjudicate any Breed Class, Group Specials Class or General Specials Class.

161 – replaced

(a) The owner of a neutered dog registered with the ANKC Ltd which:

- (1) Wins not fewer than four Neuter Certificates/Best Neuter of Breed Certificates under not fewer than four (4) different Judges at four (4) different exhibitions; and
- (2) Gains a total of one hundred (100) points, of which twenty five (25) of these points are gained after the age of twelve (12) months; may apply for such dog to be known as a Neutered Champion.

(b) Points shall be allotted for exhibits six (6) months of age and over exhibited in the Neuter Class as follows:

- (1) Neuter Certificate Winner – Dogs:
Five (5) points plus one (1) point for each Neutered dog of the breed exhibited at the fixture.
- (2) Neuter Certificate winner – Bitches:
Five (5) points plus one (1) point for each Neutered bitch of the breed exhibited at the fixture.
- (3) Best Neuter of Breed Certificate winner
Five (5) points plus one (1) point for each Neutered dog and bitch of the breed exhibited at the fixture.

The points awarded under (1), (2) and (3) above shall not accumulate and shall, in no case, exceed twenty-five (25) points at any one Show.

Only points accrued as a Neutered dog will be accepted towards the Neutered Champion title.

(c) A dog who has gained the title of Champion or Grand Champion prior to being entered on the ANKC Ltd Main register as Neutered, shall retain such title in addition to Neutered Champion. These titles shall have precedence and shall appear in front of the Neutered Champion title in the dogs registered name.

(d) The title of Neutered Champion shall fulfil the Conformation Title requirements for Dual and Triple Championships.

(e) A five (5) year moratorium is imposed on any change to the Neutered Championship Points System.

167b – altered this section only

The owner of a dog which wins no fewer than 1,000 points, including three (3) All Breeds Best In Shows; or ten (10) Best in Group / Multi Breed or Breed Specialty Best In Show may apply to the CCC(Q) for such dog to be awarded the title “Supreme Champion”, provided the following provisions are also met;

179A – added

LURE COURSING TITLES

As from 1st January 2015, on application and upon payment of the fees set out in the scale of charges, the CCC(Q) may, at its discretion, issue the following:

1. Single Stake Titles (sFCH), (sLCM), (sLCX), (sLCX2), (sLCX3) etc
2. Veteran Stake Titles (vFCH), (vLCM), (vLCX), (vLCX2) (vLCX3) etc
3. Open Stake Titles (FCH)
4. Field Champion StakeTitles (LCM), (LCX), (LCX2), (LCX3) etc
5. Coursing Ability Titles (CA), (CAA), (CAX), (CAX2), (CAX3) etc.

The dog’s original certificate of registration is to be attached to the application.

179B – added

SLED SPORTS TITLES

As from 1st January 2015, on application and upon payment of fees set out in the scale of charges, the CCC(Q) may, at its discretion, issue the following titles:

1. Working Team Dog (WTD)
2. Working Team Dog Excellence (WTDX)
3. Working Lead Dog (WLD)
4. Working Lead Dog Excellence (WLDX)



5. Working Lead Dog (WLD)
6. Working Lead Dog Excellence (WLDX)
7. Working Pack Dog (WPD)
8. Working Pack Dog Excellence (WPDX)
9. Working Weight Pull Dog (WWPD)
10. Working Weight Pull Dog Excellence (WWPDX).

The dog's original certificate of registration is to be attached to the application.

181 – replaced

Dogs awarded two (2) Champion Titles, one (1) Title must be a Conformation Champion the other Title in any of the other ANKC Ltd recognised disciplines shall be granted the Title 'Dual Champion' and the Title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Title indicated in brackets e.g. DUAL CH. [O]

In the case of an application for a 'Dual Champion' where the Neuter Champion replaces the Conformation Champion the Title 'Dual Champion' shall be granted and the Title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Title indicated in brackets e.g. DUAL CH. (Neuter) [O]."

182 – replaced

Dogs awarded three (3) Champion Titles, one (1) Title must be a Conformation Champion, the other Titles in any of the other ANKC Ltd recognised disciplines shall be granted the Title 'Triple Champion' and the Title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Titles indicated in brackets e.g. TRIPLE CH [O] [T].

In the case of an application for a 'Triple Champion' where the Neuter Champion replaces the Conformation Champion, the Title 'Triple Champion' shall be granted and the Title shall appear before the name of the dog with the other discipline Titles indicated in brackets e.g. TRIPLE CH (Neuter) [O] [T].

280j – replaced

If the dog has been castrated, or if the bitch has been spayed, except where a proven sire or dam is entered in the Veteran Class or dogs are entered in Neuter Classes.

The RAFT Committee assists Dogs Queensland in supporting the Field and Retrieving trialling community (Clubs and individuals) in assuring field sports for working gundogs continue to thrive and individuals have the opportunity to participate in field events sanctioned by the ANKC.

2015 Queensland State Retrieving Championship

29th and 30th August

The 2015 Queensland State Retrieving Championship was organised by Dogs Queensland via the RAFT Championship Committee with the support of Queensland Triallers and in particular the Wide Bay Working Gundog Club.



Competing were a range of Gundog breeds commonly found at Retrieving Trials across Australia:- Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Dogs, Golden Retrievers, Labradors, Flatcoat Retrievers, English Springer Spaniels, German Shorthaired Pointers.

It was held in cattle grazing sections of the Pieper property tucked near the Burnett River in the north-west of and relatively close to Bundaberg. The combination of valleys, dry creek lines and dams was eminently suitable for the purpose of a retrieving trial.

As this was the lead up event to the 46th Australian National Retrieving Championship, competitors came from all over Australia including Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia.

Forty two dogs were entered including: Labradors, German Shorthaired Pointers, Flatcoated Retrievers, Golden Retrievers and a Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Dog.

The event involved six runs to be completed by the dogs and handlers. Two runs were set for day one and four runs for day two.

As one of the Judges Mr. Dom Colasimone was unwell, the reserve Judge Mrs. Georgina Golle kindly stepped in to cover.

Runs and pick up order:

Run 2 Triple mark on land:- Go to mark, middle mark, right mark. Moderately heavy, undulating grassland.

Top Scorer: Dog No: 16 GR RT CH Acolon prince of Cypher (Imp UK) Mr. K. Britton (VIC) 58pts

Run 4: Diversionary mark, single mark and blind: Blind, mark. Light covered valley with rising edges.

Top Scorer: Dog No: 33 Nat. RT CH Adderslot
Chief: Mr. R. Whitechurch (VIC) 59pts

Run 6: Mark on edge of dam and two blinds across water with diversion: Middle blind, right blind, left mark. Small dam.

Top Scorer: Dog No: 33 Nat. RT CH Adderslot
Chief: Mr. R. Whitechurch (VIC) 57pts.

It was a pleasure to watch outstanding work from many dogs and a real honour to co-judge with such an experienced and successful judge and handler as Mrs. Georgina Golle.

My Judge's award went to FT CH and RT CH Inkaline Nevada and Mr. R. Thomas for a faultless line on a blind retrieve across water.

I was honoured to accept an invitation from Dogs Queensland to be the Reserve Judge should the need arise, and as it happened, Dom Colasimone, the contracted judge was unable to fulfil his contract and I wish Dom a speedy recovery.

It was a pleasure to co-judge with Elio Colasimone, a much respected judge within the Field and Retrieving disciplines.

Run 1 Double Rise/Two Bird

A bird was cast approximately 130 metres on the face of a hill where the dog had to negotiate a ridge and steep gully before climbing the hill to the bird.

The Two Bird was cast to the left of the handler into an adjoining gully as the dog was returning to the handler.

The dog delivered the first Mark and then sent back to retrieve the Double Rise Bird and finally the Two Bird.

Highest Scoring Dog: No 6 – NTL and GR RTCH. BEEREEGAN LAST BOY SCOUT CM – M. Davis (Vic) 59 points. Excellent Retrieves, which were negotiated as I set the test.

Run 3 Triple Retrieve consisting of a Blind, Double Mark with the first Mark being a Walk-Up.

This run was set on a lagoon surrounded by vegetation which grows along the banks of such a waterway. Along the right hand bank at approximately 50 metres a Diversionary Rabbit was placed amongst timber and beyond the rabbit were 6 decoy ducks.

The dog was left in a hide, handler walked to a firing point and fired at the Blind at approx 130 metres, then reloaded.

The dog was called to heel and the walk up commenced, with the handler and dog needing to turn sharply to the left to view the cast bird at 50 metres which fell on open ground. The handler and dog then proceeded to the final firing point.

A Mark at 110 metres was cast on the left hand bank of the lagoon into short spindly grass.

Handlers were instructed of the requirement for the dog to swim towards the blind which was placed in light cover a further 10 metres from the edge of the lagoon.

The second retrieve was the Mark and finally the Walk up Mark.

A special mention was on dog No. 23 GR RTCH. KADNOOK SPORTING SPIRIT – J. Lawton (VIC) with a perfect retrieve of the Blind leg of this run.

Highest Scoring dog: No. 38 – ADDERSLOT TUSCANYS ARROW (AI) handled by R. Whitechurch (VIC) 57 points.

I witnessed good work from dogs and handlers on this run.

Run 5 Double Fall with a Diversionary Bird

Set in a valley with elevated ground on both sides. The handler and dog walked along a track and fired at a diversionary bird at 50 metres, slightly to the right, which was attached to a line to move the bird away simulating wounded game.

The handler and dog then proceeded to the firing point and fired at a Mark 120m directly in front.

The dog was sent for the Mark and at a designated point the Double Fall bird was cast to the left of the dog, landing across a wet area onto a hillside. 18 dogs were presented to me for this run.

Equal Highest Scoring dogs: No. 33 - NAT RTCH. ADDERSLOT CHIEF – R. Whitechurch (Vic) and No. 38 - ADDERSLOT TUSCANYS ARROW (AI) handled by R. Whitechurch (Vic) on 58 points each.

I had the pleasure of awarding 2 Judge's Awards- My personal Award to: **No. 26 RTCH. ELLISHEA JUST CUSSY owner H. Ellis (W.A.)** for the memorable way this dog negotiated my 5th run, in a manner which impressed me greatly. Judges Award, sponsored by the RAFT Committee to- **No. 38 - ADDERSLOT TUSCANYS ARROW (AI) handled by R. Whitechurch (Vic)** For the speed and accuracy in marking over my course.

I wish to thank the R.A.F.T. Sub-Committee for the organisation of this Retrieving Championship, the stewards who assisted me and the competitors for demonstrating their training/competing skills and sportsmanship with their pure bred Gundogs.

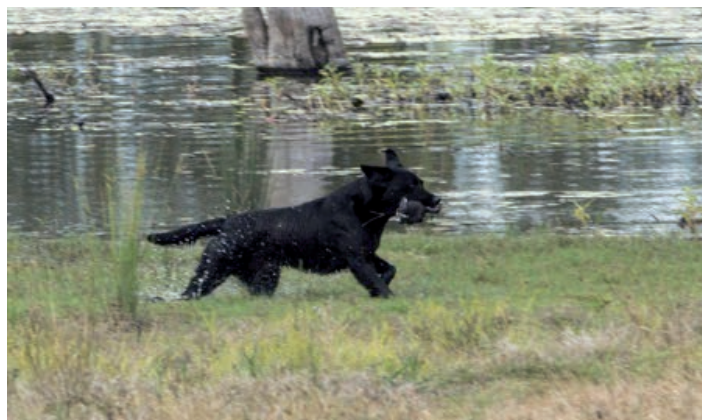

The 46th Australian National Retrieving Championship

4th, 5th, and 6th September 2015

Under the umbrella of the Australian National Kennel Council (ANKC) and via Dogs Queensland, the Queensland RAFT and Championship Committee the **46th Australian National Retrieving Championship** was held in the Wide Bay region of Queensland on properties between Bundaberg and Childers. Much support was received from the Queensland trialling community and in particular the Wide Bay Working Gundog Club.

Day one (two runs) and day three (two runs) were held at picturesque Lake Redbrook Holiday Retreat near Childers. This area has a significant wetland environment allowing the judges to set interesting and challenging runs with significant water components.

Most visiting handlers stayed at this retreat and the owners Sharon and Gary Walters kindly allowed the use of it for part of the event.

Day two (four runs) was at cattle grazing country on a property closer to Bundaberg, nestled near the Burnett River. This was with the kind permission of Girda and George Hobbi. This area has significant subtropical pasture and undulating terrain with some prominent gullies.

All the handlers gather before the start of the 46th Australian National Retrieving Championship.

Forty-eight dogs were entered with one being scratched. Breeds presented included 30 Labradors, 9 German Shorthaired Pointers, 4 Golden Retrievers, 2 Flatcoated Retrievers, 1 Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever and 1 English Springer Spaniel.

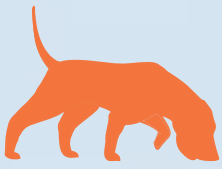

Rally Hints and Tips

New Rules Summary

As of 1st January, new Rules will come into effect for Rally-O as well as Obedience and Agility. You can download the new Rules from the ANKC website at:

Here is a highlight of the changes in Rally-O

- Qually scores and the number of quallies required for titles are changing. We are all going to have to work a bit harder to score a qually from now on – particularly in the higher grades. From 2016 the qualifications for titles in each level are:

Novice	3 quallies of 75 points or more
Advanced	3 quallies of 80 points or more
Excellent	5 quallies of 80 Points or more
Masters	7 quallies of 85 points or more

- Masters Class – a new class has been introduced with some new stations to go with it. A number of the existing stations have also been renumbered so Clubs and Competitors will either have to download a new set of signs or alter their existing ones and download the new ones. The new exercises are below. Plus there will be no jumps in Masters Class although the course can be up to 24 stations (excluding Start and Finish).

- RAE – still exists but has changed. It will now require 5 double quallies (advanced and excellent) at 80 Points or more. (The Rules at this point say 'on the same day' which is a typo and will be fixed. RAE is still definitely a double qually at the same trial.)

- Rally Obedience Champion. Now the top achievers will be eligible to compete for a Champion title. This will entail earning 10 quallies of 90 points or more.

- Honor is gone!

- More Heeling – the distance between stations is now a minimum of 4 metres and the ring lengths will be longer so competitors will be more tested on their heeling between stations.

- Jump heights haven't changed.
- Back Up 3 Steps – that one is still there but now moved to Masters and out of Excellent.
- Offset Figure Eight – new diagram has been included to clarify the path that should be taken through this station. Although the Rules still say 'crossing the centre line three times', the diagram now clearly shows that the teams must cross the centre 'point' 3 times.

39. Offset Figure 8 - This exercise requires two pylons or posts placed about 2.45 – 3.00 metres apart, around which the team will perform a complete Figure 8, crossing the centre line three times. Two distractions will be arranged to the sides of the Figure 8 about 1.55 – 1.85 metres apart. Entry may be between the pylons or posts and the distraction on either side. The distractions will consist of two securely covered containers with tempting dog treats; however, dog toys may replace one or both containers, or may be placed next to the containers. The exercise sign may be placed on or near the cone where entry is made into the Offset Figure 8.

- One new Novice sign is:

32. Moving - Stand - Whilst moving with the dog in heel position, the Handler commands and/or signals the dog to stand as the Handler comes to a stop next to the dog. Once the dog is completely paused in a stand, the Handler moves forward, commanding the dog to move forward from stand position. (Stationary exercise)

- No new signs in Advanced
- The three new Excellent signs are:

50. Halt – Leave Dog - Recall - The Handler commands and/or signals the dog to sit and stay, then leaves the dog approximately 5 metres, performs an about turn, halts and commands and/or signals the dog to come. The dog shall sit in front of the Handler. The Handler shall return to the right side of the dog by either a step back to the side or around the dog. Handler must pause upon returning to the dog. (Stationary exercise)

51. Circle Spin at Heel – The dog to complete a circle spin away from the heel position and then to return to heel. The Handler does not stop moving.

52. Four Cone Figure 8 – This exercise requires four cones to be placed in a square, each 1.5 metres from the centre point. The team must negotiate each opposite pair of cones as a Figure 8. The exercise sign shall be placed at the cone at which the team will negotiate the first Figure 8. (May be used as a change of direction).



The six new Masters signs are:

<p>54. Halt – Leave Dog – Down – Sit - Distance Commands - Return – The Handler halts and the dog sits. The handler leaves the dog and walks forward at least 3 metres, performs an about turn and halts. The Handler commands and/or signals the dog to down. Once the dog is in down position, the Handler commands and/or signals the dog to sit. Once the dog is in sit position, the Handler returns around back of dog into heel position. The Handler must pause in heel position before moving forward to the next station. (Stationary Exercise).</p>	
<p>55. Stand – Leave Dog – Down - Sit - Distance Commands – Return - Whilst moving with the dog in heel position, the Handler commands and/or signals the dog to stand as the Handler comes to a stop next to the dog. With the dog in a stand, the Handler leaves the dog and walks forward 3 metres, performs an about turn and halts. The Handler then commands and/or signals the dog to down. Once the dog is in down position, the Handler commands and/or signals the dog to sit. Once dog is in sit position, the Handler returns around the back of dog into heel position. Handler must pause in heel position before moving forward to the next station. (Stationary exercise)</p>	
<p>56. Moving Stand – Leave Dog - Distance Down – Whilst heeling and without pausing, the Handler commands and/or signals the dog to stand and leaves the dog to a distance at least 3 metres, turns, halts, commands and/or signals the dog to drop, then returns around the dog and, without pausing, continues on. (Stationary exercise)</p>	
<p>57. Moving Down - Walk Around Dog - Whilst heeling and without pausing, the Handler will down the dog and walk around the dog to the left, returning to heel position. The Handler must pause in heel position after returning to the dog. The dog must move forward from the down position with the Handler at completion. (Stationary exercise)</p>	
<p>58. Moving Sit – Walk Around Dog - Whilst heeling and without pausing, the Handler will sit the dog and walk around the dog to the left, returning to heel position. The Handler must pause in heel position after returning to the dog. The dog must move forward from the sit position with the Handler at completion. (Stationary exercise)</p>	
<p>59. Halt – Leave Dog - Call To Heel – The Handler halts and the dog sits. The Handler leaves the dog and walks forward at least 3 metres and without pausing, calls the dog to heel. The dog is expected to catch up into heel position as the Handler moves forward and before the Handler reaches the next station. The dog must not anticipate the recall and must not forge significantly ahead of the Handler when coming into heel position. (Stationary exercise)</p>	

We will be running a display / seminar of the new rules and stations before the start of the Rally Triple on **5 December at Caboolture**. Start time will be **2:30pm**.

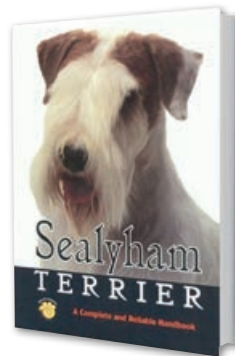
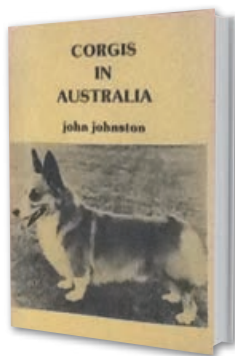

Described as the small dog with the big personality, the author has set about putting together a book that brings the reader face-to-face with the unique qualities of this breed once owned by some many famous people.

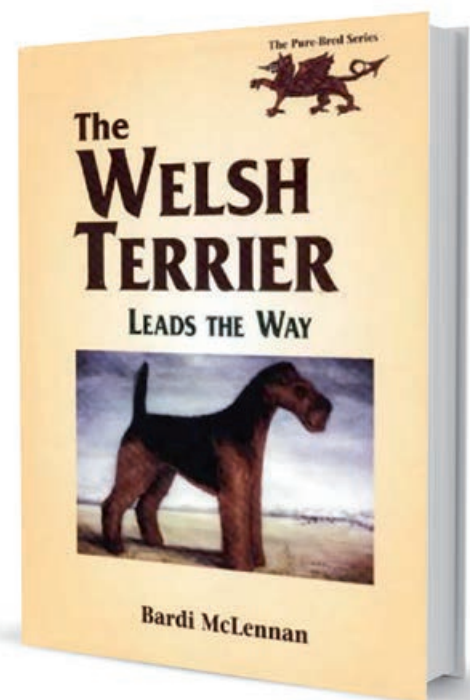
While covering the historical background, the author has set about to put together a book that is quite inspiring.

A STORY OF COURAGE

You can never tell when or how an injury may happen. This is about a Sealyham Terrier and his owners and his determination to overcome a horrific injury.

I heard this heart wrenching scream of agony, the thoughts were, a snake has bit him, then, a cane toad has poisoned him, Charlie Brown was gasping for breath, as his mates played around him.

The next door neighbour dropped everything and took us both to the vet, me holding Charlie's head up and him fighting to breathe, me in sheer controlled panic. The diagnosis was a suspected broken back and off to the specialist for further diagnosis.

I realised afterwards what had happened.

He had been playing and ran under a cast iron garden chair and mis-judged his jump and hit his back on the chair.

X-rays had shown a vertebrae had fractured and it was crushing the spinal cord, there was no feeling at all in his rear end, I was given three scenarios by Professor Moses who specialises in the animal spinal injuries.

Number one, he may never walk again. Number two, he may recover in time but he would never be stable on his legs. Number three, put him to sleep.

I had fed him with an eye dropper every two hours when he was just two days old until he was strong enough to suckle off his mum. I couldn't and wouldn't give up on him.



When informed the cost could be between \$3,000 and \$4,500 I was in double shock. I didn't think of where the money was going to come from, I said go ahead, do your best for him.

The shock when I went into see him the next day I will never forget. All his glorious furnishing gone shaved from head to toe, with feeding tubes and catheters inserted in him, and this steel rod wrapped in gauze stitched to his back, I began to doubt my decision to operate.

Twice a day I would go in and sit and talk to him even though he was zonked out with drugs. I was on automatic pilot, all my energy and pity was consumed by this pathetic Sealy who had brought such great joy to me.

For ten days I would take his dinner in and sit there while he ate it, the look of 'what has happened to me' in his eyes was heart wrenching. He wasn't allowed home until he could pee on his own, so the vet nurse and myself would carry him to the yard at the rear of the surgery.

I would hold him up by his tail and he would walk on his front legs whilst the nurse carried the catheter, it was a back breaking time.

My terrier friends were just as shocked as me, they had a whip around and gave me \$500, a very special Westie breeder sent me a further \$500. God bless them. I was able to borrow the rest of the money from the bank, \$3,850 to be paid before he could be discharged.

He was home, now for the hard work I hadn't realised was before me, he still had the catheter inserted and twice he pulled it out leaving the balloon inside his bladder, back to the vets for another day in hospital. Fortunately he peed the balloon out twice.

The third time it happened they stitched the catheter tube to the underside of his penis.

The main concern the vet had was depression setting in, so off to a dog show we went, with him in a large crate in the car, catheter in tow, he was still drugged to the eyeballs.

My friends were absolutely fabulous but whilst I was in the ring Charlie Brown had an accident in his crate.

They leaned him up, put fresh bedding in for him and made him comfortable again. I can never speak highly enough of the kindness of dog people, messages of comfort and sympathy came from around the world.

So out of the trolley he was lifted with this catheter wrapped around my wrist and over my shoulder, hanging on to his tail so we would go in the garden. I had to find an easier way rather than hanging onto his tail as it was not doing his spine or my back any good, so I made a sling out of cotton with holes for his back legs and holes for private parts.

I made it so it had long handles which would allow me to lift the back legs off the ground. I had a lead in one hand and the sling in the other so gradually we were able to go around the garden and eventually into the street with this method, we would walk a house block then home as he was walking only on his front legs, it was extremely tiring for him.

As time progressed physiotherapy and exercise was the norm for most of the day. He was a little so and so, I'm trying to work his back legs and trying to stop him from falling off the table.

I came up with the idea of putting him head first into a wire crate and anchoring him with a collar and lead so he couldn't move and turn around, if he toppled sideways he couldn't fall anywhere. That was a master stroke. He started to get feeling back, when I pinched and tickled between his pads his legs would jerk. I would work each leg from the toes to his hocks through to his hips, for ten minutes every hour.

It was rather comical at times, his front half would go one way and his rear another, it was almost like one of those dancing a rag doll with the feet sewn to a male partner's shoes. The ongoing problem was no bladder control. The nerves didn't tell him when he wanted to pee and it would build up infection after infection.

We were and still are having to monitor his bladder for any signs of problems. It's funny how the bowel wasn't affected, but he couldn't stand so he was constantly having a bath to clean him up. One of our group members on the Yahoo Sealyham Terrier site is a neurosurgeon. He sent me charts with specific exercises to do as it was costing too much to visit the physiotherapist at the vet's twice a week.

The biggest breakthrough came when he could jump up onto the rocking chair with the aid of a little stool, which was about five months ago. People who say dogs can't grin have never had one they love or loved in return.

Charlie Brown is so courageous and determined to get back in the show ring he loves. The quivering you can feel coming through his body as he tries so desperately to hold that show stance.

He was shown in the veteran class at the Sporting Terrier Club Qld in August last year, wobbly legs and all he achieved 3rd placing.

Then this month after much soul searching (will I or won't I enter him in the Toowoomba Royal), I took him to the show and he got best of breed, even though he was the only representative of the breed there, he appears to come on in leaps and bounds when he visits a show.

Every milestone is one step towards the nerves healing fully. He still can't cock his leg or stand for grooming too long. There has been so many wonderful people I have had contact with in the dog scene, that I am filled with deep gratitude towards, it is hard to express my thanks verbally.

Wendy telling this has made me aware at how far we both have come.

He is the only Sealyham to have sired two Grand Champions as well as achieving that honour himself. They are Preseli Put On The Charm and Preseli Put D Kettle On. He is Grand Champion Preseli Past N Present.

The Welsh Terrier

Originating in Wales this Black and Tan terrier is recorded in early history and poetry. In the 18th century, small terriers such as Welsh terriers were carried in small saddle bags in front of the horse rider to be put on the ground when the hounds had run the fox to earth.

The terrier's job was to enter the den and bolt the fox. The function of the Welsh, common to all Terriers is that of an 'earth stopper', or dog that will go to ground or into caves after game. Welsh Terriers have a surprisingly good ability to scent game or small vermin and have strength, courage and stamina. At first glance, the Welsh Terrier might be mistaken for a black and tan Wire Fox Terrier or Miniature Airedale, but they are neither of these breeds.

Average size, weight and lifespan:

Height: 39 cm (15 1/2 ins) at shoulder

Weight: 10 kgs

Lifespan: Welsh Terriers live up to 10 - 15 years of age

Personality, characteristics and temperament:

On seeing a Welsh Terrier for the first time one is immediately attracted by its keen intelligent expression. They are curious, playful, spontaneous, energetic and easily trained. The Welsh Terrier is a natural born clown and loves the centre of attention. Positive reinforcement winning their attention during early training is most effective. An even-tempered stable breed with an independent nature and a loving personality.

Compatibility with other pets:

As a companion dog the Welsh Terrier should be familiarised with other household pets at an early age; it will then live happily, reliably and in harmony. Cats, birds, guinea pigs may be a problem if they are nervous and the dog gives chase. The Welsh Terrier can have a dominant nature and likes to be 'top dog' that may lead to a conflict with adult dogs of the same sex, with the same dominant instinct.

Ideal owners:

Welsh terriers make excellent companions but are not the right dog for everyone. Owners should be up to the challenge of showing who is in charge for up to two years training a puppy. Small children can often compete for the same things therefore supervision is most important. Perhaps older family situations are ideally suitable.



Care requirements:

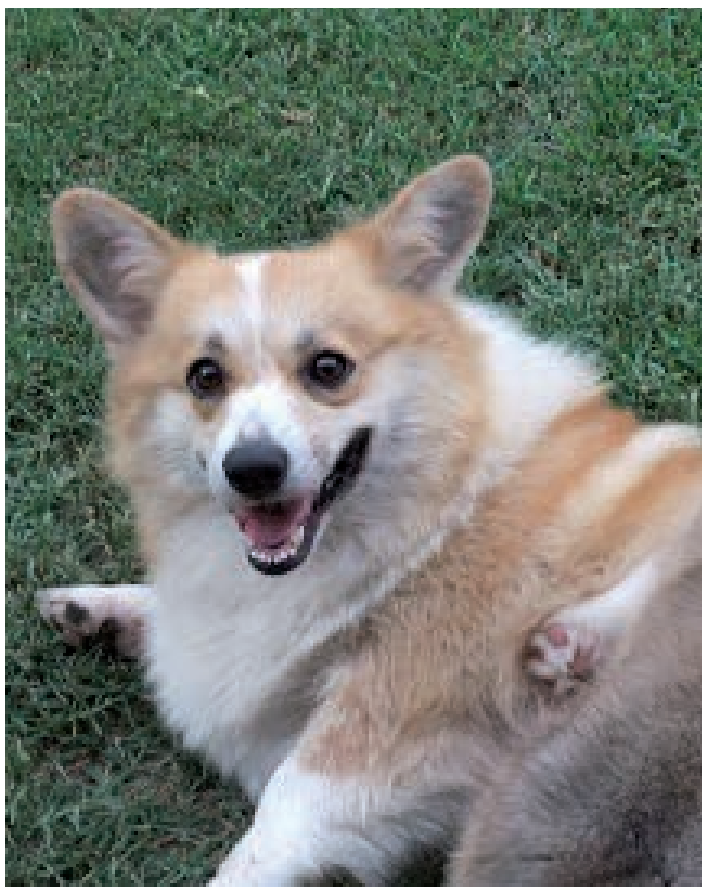
Maintenance of rough coated terriers means regular brushing through the double coat that is made of soft, dense, undercoat and harder outer wiry hair. Pet care requires clipping at least three times a year with scissoring between clips will help keep the tailored appearance, especially around feet, under arms and vent area.

Left to grow naturally, the teddy bear' look is appealing until the hair becomes matted. Hand strip for Dog Shows and clipping for pets is most suitable. This small energetic dog requires daily exercise to keep in good condition and makes for a happy dog.

In conclusion:

Now you know a little about the Welsh Terrier. If you have decided this is the dog for you, or if you would like more information, please contact either the relevant registered breeders club or Dogs Queensland.

Either will be able to give you information about available puppies and also suggest dog shows where you can see the breed and speak to a breeder.



A Few Words On The Welsh Corgi (Pembroke)

Though sharing the common name 'CORGI', the Pembroke and Cardigan have evolved from two very different breed groups. The Pembroke is a breed from the Spitz group, recognised by a sharp-pointed muzzle and foxy face, erect and point-tipped ears and a high-set and gaily carried tail.

The Cardigan belongs to the Dachshund or Teckel group, being longer in body, heavier, deeper in chest and blunter in jaw.

Corgis were being exhibited at shows as far back as 1925 and at that time, the breed was known simply as the 'Welsh Corgi' and both Pembrokes and Cardigans were all mixed and shown together. It was in 1927 that the breed had classes confined to them at the Cardiff Championship Show.

However, the official debut was really in 1928, when the breed was taken off the register of 'Any Other Variety Not Classified' at the Kennel Club, added to the list of 'Non-sporting' breeds and granted Challenge Certificates.

1934 stands out as a milestone in Corgi history as in the October, the Kennel Club scheduled for the first time, separate classes for Welsh Corgis (Pembroke) and Welsh Corgis (Cardigan) and Certificates were offered for each type.

In 1938 'The Welsh Corgi League' was founded in the United Kingdom for Pembrokes, and the League continues to this day, to hold a Championship Show and publish the breed Handbook each year.



Characteristics

First and foremost, the Pembroke was bred to work cattle on the small farms in his native Wales. Though seldom used for this purpose today, this little dog still displays his natural workmanlike ability, moving and turning at top speed. His keenness and willingness to work and please, have served him well in the obedience and agility arena.

Temperament and Personality

The Pembroke Corgi should never be shy, timid, nervous or aggressive. His handsome qualities of strength and substance should always be accompanied with an outgoing, happy, almost bombastic and pushy personality.

The Pembroke is highly intelligent, friendly and always aiming to be the centre of attention. He is extremely affectionate, loyal and loving in nature and with this attribute, this breed is a wonderful family pet and companion, suitable for all ages.

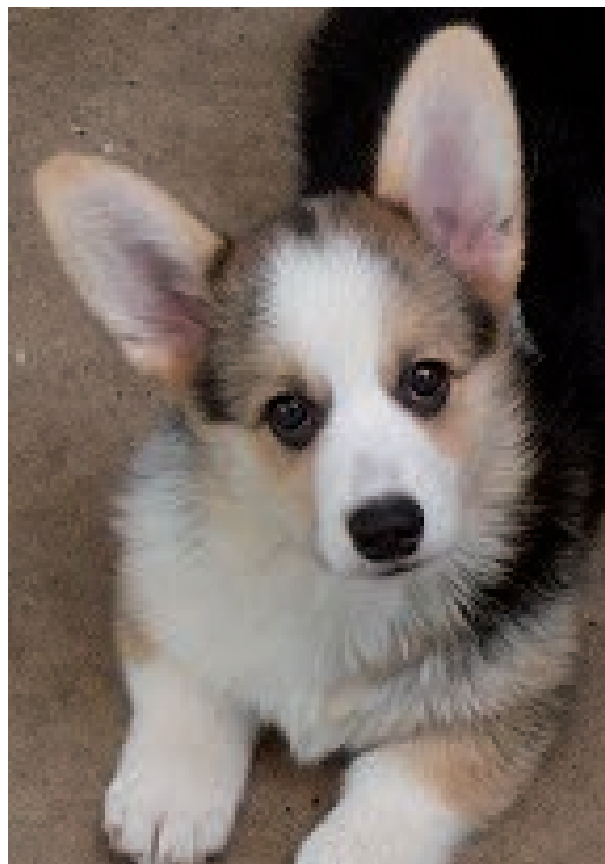

Zone 2 Dog World Column, November 2015

The year is slowly starting to wind down in Zone 2 with shows and events going into recess as the hotter months of the year approach. There are still quite a few events on in Zone 1 which many of our Zone 2 members will be travelling to attend.

What's On in Zone 2 in November?

- Championship Show for the Bundaberg Canine Club;
- Obedience and Dog Sports in Bundaberg

Some of our Zone 2 members will be planning some trips to Zone 1 for further shows and events in November including shows at the Sunshine Coast, Caboolture and Durack.

Workers Needed

The saying that "many hands make light work" is very true.

In Zone 2, we have a great group of workers who give up their time freely to help out at shows as show managers, stewards and writers. However, this group of people is small and is getting smaller as more and more become burned out.

The reason for this is that we are asking the same people all the time to do things whilst the majority of exhibitors do not get involved. Many of these exhibitors simply want to enjoy a relaxing weekend which is fine but without the support of workers at shows, they won't have shows to relax at.

More and more we are seeing delays at shows as we need to wait for workers to become available and all too often the calls for a volunteer goes unanswered.

This leaves us with a few choices:

- More people to become involved and do the training to help out at shows – if we have a large pool of workers then the jobs can be allocated out and it means that we do not have to work all that often as the roles can be rotated – this allows everyone to be able to enjoy their showing more and to have a relaxing weekend; or
- A higher cost on entries or a surcharge so that paid workers can be brought in to do the jobs.

Unfortunately, we can't have the best of both worlds, if people don't wish to work, then they will have to pay to have people work for them.

In most hobbies and sports, it is quite unusual for participants to not support it by the way of working. For example, in tennis or other such sports, teams or individuals are required to umpire as part of their participation and / or in other club type competitions, teams are required to provide workers for canteens and offices.

Dogs Queensland offers show training to people to give them the background and an understanding of the rules, roles and responsibilities of show managing, stewarding and writing. These are not difficult tasks to perform.

Training in Zone 2 will be available while the show season goes into recess and there will be opportunities in November, December and January to participate in this.

I would encourage all members to get involved and to put their hands up at shows to work for one group. If everyone pitched in, we would probably only need to work maybe once a month.

Rules in Action

There are many times we have witnessed unhappy exhibitors at shows and whilst we are not required to like or agree with decisions that are made, there is an expectation that we conduct ourselves in an appropriate manner and keep our emotions in check.

Rule 224 states:

"Any person causing annoyance by loud comments on the decision of the judges or being guilty of unsportsmanlike action while in the precincts of an exhibition shall be guilty of an offence against these rules and may, after being cautioned by a member of the show committee or other official of the show, be ordered to leave the show. If such person fails to comply with such order he shall be guilty of a further offence against these rules."

There have been many times that we, as exhibitors, have probably heard comments or witnessed behaviour that has bordered on a breach of this rule.

I can guarantee that show officials would prefer not to have to deal with an issue such as this; however, Dogs Queensland is committed and has these rules in place to ensure that we maintain a harmonious environment at our shows.

Please be mindful that loud comments and statements against the judging that are public and audible are against the rules. Whilst it is natural to vent, please ensure that this happens away from the rings and preferably when you have returned home.

Facebook and social media

Social media is a wonderful tool and can be used to promote our wonderful hobby to a much wider audience than we were ever able to.

However, we do need to be mindful that everything we post on Facebook is considered a publication under the law, and we are responsible not only legally for what we post online but under our rules as well.

I have seen some very spirited debates on Facebook and these should not be quashed, however, we do need to be conscious of what we say and the way we say it to ensure that we are still showing respect to others, being accurate and not defaming anyone as there are consequences if we cross these boundaries.

A sound policy is one where if we consider that a post may be controversial, it is probably best to reword it or reconsider it, prior to hitting the 'post' button.

A keyboard does not provide any shield from the rules of Dogs Queensland or the law and it is all too easy to capture a screen shot so the moment is there in perpetuity.

While on the subject of social media and Facebook, it is true that not all of us get along so may have each other on block or restricted view.

This is usually for a reason so if you are one of the people who like to take screen shots and send them on to people who would not normally see them, or inform others about what people are posting on their sites which is not intended for them, you are causing a problem!

The whole dog community and the people involved do not need you to cause a problem. Please do not kid yourself that you are doing someone a favour or righteously sharing necessary information – you are not – you are causing a problem!

We have enough issues without people stirring up trouble behind the scenes. This type of behaviour is worse than that of anyone who is involved in a confrontation.

There was dense scrub surrounding us with thick tee trees which had short prickly branches and the weedy grass was in full growth, when they ran through the grass all you could see would be a bum up in the air then just a head would pop up and down and they would be jumping just like a rabbit.

They would hunt for hours, content to be free and face great adventures. BUT, little did one of them realise what adventures lay ahead of them.

A woebegone Sealyham returned on its own without mum at dusk. Much to our concern all we could do was shout at the top of our voices SUSIEeee, SUSIEeeeeee, SUSIEeeee, hoping she would hear our call and come home. All through the night we would go outside and call then sit and listen for a whimper and bark at the door for us to let her in. NOTHING.

As we stirred in the early hours of the morning Carrie was scratching at the door to get out, "NO WAY I SAID. We have lost your mum already and I'm not taking any chances on you".

It was early spring and we dreaded the thought of her laying dead under a tree with a snake bite. So off my husband and I went in different directions looking for her. We both returned home after searching hours for her both in tears at our loss.

This searching went on for two more days, on the third day Carrie was beside herself frantically trying to get out. I relented and let her out for a run. She went like lightning over a rise and here I am yelling at the top of my voice for her to come back, terrified I would loose her as well.

She came back over the rise just in sight of me and stood and barked and barked and barked. I told her I wasn't playing games with her as I thought she wanted me to chase her. Then I said "alright I might as well go in the direction you're heading", well off she took and every so often she would stop and look to see if I was following her and bark to draw my attention.

Off I went! Head down sweeping the undergrowth away, spiders and cobwebs and all sorts of insects attaching themselves to my hair me dreading the thought of coming across a snake.

Up the hills and then down and across a small stream Carrie leading the way, I had no idea of direction. I wondered why I was allowing this little minx of mine to play games with me.

Down the hill she went still barking and turning to me, then all of a sudden she disappeared down a hole. I arrived at the hole yelling at her to get out as there could be a snake there. Much to my amazement and shock I could hear a muffled bark coming from underground. I shouted Susie at the top of my voice and the barking became more frantic.

I was in a dilemma, what was I to do? I had brought no lead or spade with me, how was I to find my way back to this spot if I went for help. I was to far from the house for anyone to hear me call.

I rationalised that Carrie had brought me to this place once where mum was buried could she do it again. I encouraged Carrie to come back with me but she wanted to stay with mum, finally she started to follow me home. I ran like a mad woman through the bush yelling we've found her. Grabbing a rake and my husband and son got the spades, we put our faith in Carrie again and told her to go. We didn't expect her to do it again but we had no choice but to follow her. Down through the bush again she went straight to where mum was buried barking all the time.

We started to dig, for a moment we could hear her barking and crying and I think the digging gave her a sense of direction and started to dig from her side.

It didn't take long for her to dig her way out.

The biggest laugh as well as tears of relief was, as she was bounding up the hill with her daughter she gave a big shake and both of them ran home like two conspirators. I could well imagine the conversation between them. Mum telling daughter off 'Why didn't you come earlier you knew I was buried' the answer was "the dumb fool I tried to tell her but she wouldn't let me out".

I am still amazed as I recall the events at how intelligent the Sealys are, to lead me to her and how did Carrie know I needed her to take me back to where mum was and how did she find the place twice. I surmised that it was a fox hole and they had been playing in it and it had caved in, how she managed to stay alive with little air I will never know.



Historic Legacy

The Sealyham Mansion

Captain John Tucker Edwards, soldier and sportsman, owned the Sealyham estate in Pembrokeshire, between Haverfordwest and Fishguard. He was married to Anna Jane Jones.

He devoted his retirement to hunting. He retired in 1848 at the age of 40 and after that he spent his days hunting the fox, otters, badger and polecats in the terrain around his home. For this he used Otterhounds in packs and small local terriers. These terriers did not suit Mr Edwards for many reasons. He wanted a small dog with strong jaws, active, short-legged and the terrier should be white.

The Captain died in 1891 in his eighty-second year. His only son died six months later.

His daughter-in-law, Mrs Victor Higgon, continued to live at Sealyham Mansion for many years and she continued to breed, judge, and show Sealyhams with the affix 'of Sealy' until the Second World War.

Back to the origin of the breed. It is not known exactly what he used to create the breed. It is thought that he used the Welsh Corgi for length of back, size and lowness to ground. But on the other hand Edward Ashe writes in his book 'Practical Dog Book' that the Sealyham itself was a progenitor of the Corgi!

Tom Horner says in his book 'Terriers of the World' that without any doubt the Dandie Dinmont was used to shorten the legs. The Cheshire Terrier, a small Bull Terrier was probably used for gameness. But here again there is disagreements among the historians. Sir Jocelyn Lucas, who kept, bred and worked with Sealyhams for many years, suggests in his book 'The new book of the Sealyham' (1929) that the white, smooth-coated breed known as the Cheshire Terrier was the natural choice for Mr Edwards to use. It had the points he wanted and lived fairly close by.

Robert Leighton in his 'Complete Book of the Dog' dismisses both the Dandie Dinmont and the Bull Terrier and puts forward the West Highland White Terrier instead as being the breed that Mr Edwards used.



He bases his argument on Edwards friendship with the Marquis of Bute who owned estates in Wales and was a personal friend of Colonel Malcolm of Poltalloch in Scotland, on whose estate the West Highland White Terrier was first bred.

Another breed that could have been used was the Wire Fox Terrier. Mr Fred Lewis, one of the early breeders and a friend of Captain Edwards, was opposed to this cross ever been made.

However there are others that are certain that Wire Fox Terriers did play a part in the Sealyham's development. This could have taken place after the death of the Captain. What we know for sure (thanks to Mr Henry Sutliff III) is that Smooth Fox Terrier was used.

On a pedigree found by Mr Sutliff in the Dyfed archives in 1989, is clearly shown that a Smooth Fox Terrier was used. The pedigree is of the bitch 'Microbe' born 1906. Her grandfather Dip II (father to the famous Peer Gynt) was a great grandchild to a Smooth Fox Terrier.

PICKING-UP WITH A SEALYHAM

IF YOU COULD TAKE JUST ONE DOG OUT SHOOTING, WHICH WOULD YOU CHOOSE?

Nick Ridley suggests the Sealyham terrier, after witnessing them picking-up first-hand.

I get a real buzz out of watching any kind of 'working' dog do what it was bred for, whether that is a hard-going spaniel tearing apart a bramble bush to extract a wily old cock pheasant, a Labrador taking the line of a 100-yard runner or a lurcher working with ferrets to bag a few rabbits.

Over the years, I have been lucky enough to work a few different breeds of working dogs and in recent years, I have started to consider if there is such a thing as the perfect all-round canine country companion.

The first thing to do is to throw out all thoughts of tradition and accept that there will be compromises with this all-rounder.

One breed to consider is the Border Collie. On a shoot I pick-up on, one of the beaters brings along a Collie which hunts quite nicely and is not a bad retriever. However, it is not keen on gunshot and as many collies have a sensitive nature this may rule them out. The lurcher is a pretty versatile type of dog and I know of a couple of people that use collie-cross greyhounds for deerstalking.

However, if you were to turn up at a shoot with one you might be under suspicion of being some kind of 'dodgy geezer' due to the unfortunate stereotype and it can be difficult to stop a lurcher from chasing.



The Sealyham selection

So how about a terrier? A few months back when I was doing some research for an article on the working Sealyham Terrier I came across a piece written many years ago by politician and prolific Sealyham breeder Sir Jocelyn Lucas. Writing in his book, *The Sealyham Terrier*, back in 1922, he claimed that “a well-trained pack of Sealyhams are better than spaniels in the beating line” and that got me thinking.

After a few phone calls to Sealyham breeder Harry Parsons, a date was set for him to bring along some of his dogs to a prestigious shooting estate in the Cotswolds. Harry also told me about “Winnie,” a Sealyham bitch he had bred and whose owner, Dave Simms, had trained to work with the gun and to retrieve.

It has to be pointed out that neither Harry, Dave or the dogs had ever been on a driven shoot before, so the pressure really was on.

Dogs and ducks

Pegglesworth Manor is a stunning estate and as it was a “family and friends” day, the owners had kindly allowed the terriers to take part. The little dogs certainly caused a stir, especially among the Guns as many of them had travelled from abroad and were fascinated to meet such a rare breed.

As we walked to the first drive I had a chance to speak to Dave and he told me that Winnie was his first Sealyham Terrier, before that he had worked Plummers, but had decided he wanted a more versatile dog and he had trained Winnie to work with ferrets. He takes her roughshooting and enjoys a day’s ratting, but most interesting of all he has trained her to retrieve to hand.

We had been warned that the first drive was going to be a busy one as squadrons of duck were pushed from a pond over the waiting Guns. I explained to Dave what was going to happen and as he slipped the lead from Winnie I asked him if he was sure she would be okay off it. There would be a lot of shooting and a lot of birds falling, but he assured me she would be fine.

A good number of ducks were shot on that particular drive and I was spellbound watching Winnie standing next to Dave.

Throughout the whole drive, the little dog did not make a sound, she showed no signs of getting wound up. She watched and marked the duck as they were shot and most impressive of all, as the other dogs were being sent to pick the odd runner, she made no attempt to move. I really was impressed.

As the horn went to end the drive, I told Dave he could now send the dog out, it was then he confessed that Winnie had in fact never picked a duck before – she had retrieved pheasants and rabbits, but never duck. Dave lined her up like a little Labrador and sent her out. Winnie found her first duck without any hesitation and took it straight back, she collected another five and every single one was delivered to Dave's waiting hand. Not one of them had any damage, her mouth was as soft as any gundog's.

Sealyham Terriers make excellent ratters.

Meanwhile, Harry had joined the beating line with two of his other Sealyhams, 'Betty' and 'Madge,' and he had been put in the thick of it.

He had been tasked with blanking in a section of old blackthorn to push the birds up to a flushing point, so there was the potential for matters to go very wrong. Madge and Betty bustled through the heavy cover and every time a bird flushed, Harry gave them a 'hold up' command and they waited until told to 'get on.'

The terriers really showed their worth in a particularly dense patch of tangled roots and their tenacity evicted more than one pheasant from its sanctuary. I was again impressed by the dog's calmness, I know for a fact my cockers would have been getting very hot with the amount of birds that were moving in front of them but the little dogs went about their work with a minimum of fuss.

Behind the Guns, Winnie and Dave were really getting into the swing of things and were fast becoming part of the picking-up team. Their high point came when Winnie disappeared into a block of woodland and came back with a runner. I did take a sneaky look at the bird and was amazed to find that it had no damage other than the shot wound.

I would have put money on that bird being damaged by the terrier, especially if she had to chase it down, but I was wrong.



By the end of the day, I was convinced that I had found the perfect all-round canine fieldsports companion.

Earlier in the year, I witnessed a pack of working Sealyham Terriers clear a chicken shed of rats, I have seen them work with ferrets, I know of their abilities as a subterranean terrier and now I had seen them work in the beating line and as a picking-up dog on a big driven shoot.

I think these little dogs have all the natural ability and it would just take some time and training to make one into a real Jack of all trades.

HISTORY OF BREEDS

The Pembroke Welsh Corgi and the Cardigan Welsh Corgi

The Pembroke Welsh Corgi originated from the small, hardy, natural bob-tailed cattle dogs of the Pembrokeshire area in Wales. Their heritage endows them with all those valuable instincts of a working dog, a friend and helper of man possessing an independent spirit that originally enabled them to control the Welsh cattle without undue direction from their masters.

Chosen as a pet by the British Royal Family in 1935, the Pembroke Welsh Corgi is now one of the best known breeds, particularly in Commonwealth countries, being highly successful in both show and obedience rings world wide and extremely popular as a family pet.

The Pembroke is certainly a robust dog, his ample get-up-and-go will make him ready for any type of work or play; by nature cheerful and affectionate his natural intelligence makes him alert, and inquisitive, he thrives on attention, yet is content to take his well earned rest at his master's feet.

His distinctive head is foxy in shape and appearance.

An ideal height of 10 to 12 inches (25.4 to 30.5 cm) and weight of 22 to 26 lbs (10 to 12 kg) makes them small enough to fit comfortably in the family car and live happily in the suburban back yard.

His beautiful short coat requires only a quick brush to keep clean and shiny plus an occasional comb to keep the undercoat and skin in good condition.

The Pembroke comes in a wide range of colours including the eye catching tri colour, a combination of black with tan and white markings. Traditional coat colours vary through all shades of red, fawn, sable and black with tan, and usually have smart white markings on feet, legs, chest and foreface.

The Pembroke is traditionally recognised by a short or bob-tail. As a consequence of the ban on docking in Australia, many Pembrokes will now be seen with a part or full length tail. However, as the gene that produces naturally bob or short tails is a dominant one in the Pembroke, there will still be Pembrokes found with this characteristic feature of a short bob-tail.

The Cardigan Welsh Corgi is one of the oldest of the Welsh dog breeds and is generally acknowledged as being the original Corgi or small 'dwarf' dog of Wales.

Since very ancient times they were used as a sheep and cattle herder, guard dog, general purpose farm dog, friend and companion in the lonely Crofters huts of the remote Welsh hillside country of Cardiganshire.



No official pedigree records exist of the original Cardigan Corgis and it was not until about 1930 that separate show registers for both Cardigan and Pembroke types were recognised by the English Kennel Club.

Despite some interbreeding with their Pembroke cousins at the time, the Cardigan Corgi with their ancient lineage have dominantly retained their individual characteristics, particularly their steady sensible temperament and tractable nature, signified always by an expressive waving tail.

The Cardigan Corgi today, although never experiencing the impetus of Royal patronage, continues to maintain its popularity, particularly as an obedience dog and family pet. Standing about 12 inches (30 cm) high at the shoulder with head foxy in shape and appearance, they have pricked ears that are characteristically larger and more rounded than those of their Pembroke cousins.

Usually a heavier dog than the Pembroke, they are slightly longer in back with a tail that stretches out behind like a fox's brush. With front feet that turn slightly outwards for balance, Cardigan Corgis are very agile and extremely strong for their size.

They have exceptionally sensitive hearing and make excellent watchdogs. Very adaptable, Cardigans are equally at home on a large property or in a smaller suburban backyard.

They come in an even more extensive variety of colours than the Pembroke.

Their short to medium length coat can vary through all shades of red (from light tan to mahogany and sable), tricolour with either brindle or tan points, plus in addition the exclusive Cardigan colours of brindle and blue merle.

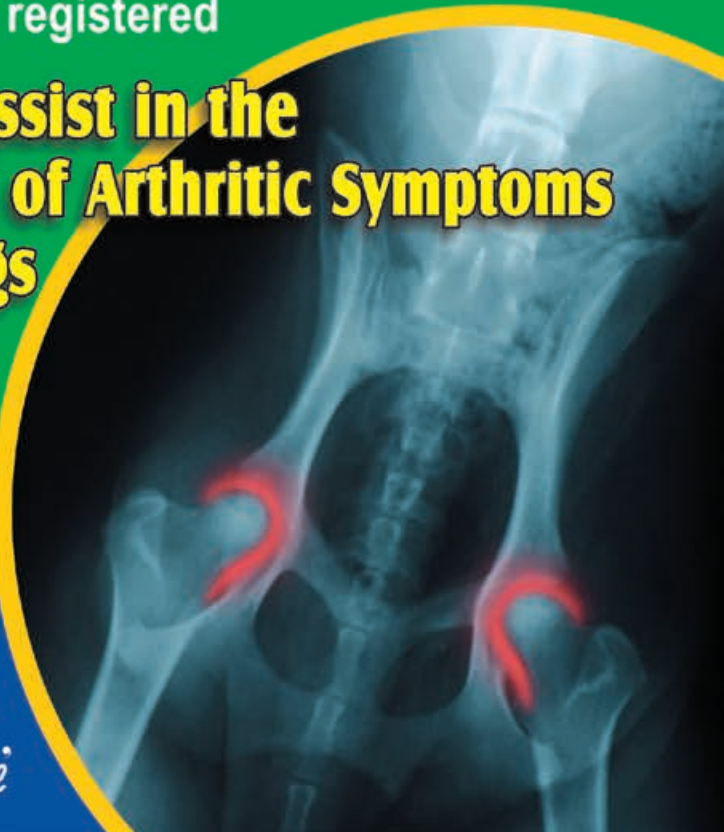
